A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to holidays for state employees.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1.006(f)(2), Election Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (2) "State holiday" means a state holiday under
- 7 Sections 662.003(b)(1) through (5) [(6)], Government Code.
- 8 SECTION 2. Sections 661.035(a) and (b), Government Code,
- 9 are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) For a state employee who at the time of death is normally
- 11 scheduled to work at least 40 hours a week, eight hours is to be
- 12 added to the employee's sick and vacation leave under Section
- 13 661.034 for each state or national holiday that is scheduled to fall
- 14 within the period after the date of death and during which the
- 15 employee could have used leave and for the floating holiday under
- 16 Section 662.006 if the employee did not receive a paid day off for
- 17 the holiday during the fiscal year in which the state employee died.
- 18 To determine the period during which leave could have been used and
- 19 the number of state or national holidays, the employee's leave is
- 20 allocated over the workdays after the employee's death and eight
- 21 hours is added as a state or national holiday occurs during the
- 22 period.
- (b) For a state employee who at the time of death is normally
- 24 scheduled to work fewer than 40 hours a week, the number of hours

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- 1 that is to be added to the employee's accumulated sick and vacation
- 2 leave for each state, floating, or national holiday is computed as
- 3 provided by Subsection (a), but is to be proportionally reduced
- 4 according to the lesser number of the employee's normally scheduled
- 5 weekly work hours.
- 6 SECTION 3. Sections 661.064(a), (b), and (c), Government
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) This subsection applies except as provided by
- 9 Subsection (c). For a state employee who on the date of separation
- 10 is normally scheduled to work at least 40 hours a week, eight hours
- 11 are to be added to the employee's accrued vacation time for each
- 12 state or national holiday that is scheduled to fall within the
- 13 period after the date of separation and during which the employee
- 14 could have used the time and for the floating holiday under Section
- 15 <u>662.006</u> if the employee did not receive a paid day off for the
- 16 holiday during the fiscal year in which the state employee
- 17 <u>separates from state employment</u>. To determine the period during
- 18 which vacation time could have been used and the number of state or
- 19 national holidays, the employee's vacation time is allocated over
- 20 the workdays after the employee's separation and eight hours are
- 21 added as a state or national holiday occurs during the period.
- (b) For a state employee who on the date of separation is
- 23 normally scheduled to work less than 40 hours a week, the number of
- 24 hours that is to be added to the employee's accrued vacation time
- 25 for each state, floating, or national holiday is computed as
- 26 provided by Subsection (a), but is to be proportionally reduced
- 27 according to the lesser number of the employee's normally scheduled

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1 weekly work hours.
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- 2 (c) For a state employee who is paid under this subchapter
- 3 because the separation from state employment involves a move to a
- 4 position in a state agency that does not accrue vacation time, no
- 5 hours may be added to the employee's accrued vacation time for a
- 6 state or national holiday which is scheduled to fall within the
- 7 period after the date of separation and during which the employee
- 8 could have used the time or for a floating holiday under Section
- 9 662.006.
- SECTION 4. Section 662.003(b), Government Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (b) A state holiday includes only the following days:
- 13 (1) [the 19th day of January, "Confederate Heroes
- 14 Day," in honor of Jefferson Davis, Robert E. Lee, and other
- 15 Confederate heroes;
- 16 $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ the second day of March, "Texas Independence
- 17 Day";
- 18 (2) [(3)] the 21st day of April, "San Jacinto Day";
- 19 (3) $[\frac{(4)}{1}]$ the 19th day of June, "Emancipation Day in
- 20 Texas," in honor of the emancipation of the slaves in Texas in 1865;
- 21 $\underline{(4)}$ [$\underline{(5)}$] the 27th day of August, "Lyndon Baines
- 22 Johnson Day," in observance of the birthday of Lyndon Baines
- 23 Johnson;
- 24 (5) [(6)] the Friday after Thanksgiving Day;
- 25 (6) $\left[\frac{(7)}{1}\right]$ the 24th day of December; and
- 26 (7) [(8)] the 26th day of December.
- SECTION 5. The heading to Section 662.006, Government Code,

- 1 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 662.006. ADDITIONAL FLOATING HOLIDAY [OPTIONAL
- 3 HOLIDAY].
- 4 SECTION 6. Section 662.006(a), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A state employee is entitled to select during a fiscal
- 7 year a paid day off from working for a state agency in addition to
- 8 the paid days off under Section 662.005 if the [An] individual [who]
- 9 is a state employee on the last workday before \underline{and} [\underline{or}] the first
- 10 workday after the day selected by the employee. A state employee
- 11 who selects a floating holiday under this section is entitled [an
- 12 optional holiday, or on both workdays, is entitled, except as
- 13 $\frac{\text{provided by Section } 662.010_{7}}{\text{l}}$ to a paid day off from working for a
- 14 state agency on the last workday before and the first workday after
- 15 the <u>floating</u> holiday if:
- 16 (1) the holiday does not fall on a Saturday or Sunday;
- 17 and
- 18 (2) the employee agrees to give up, during the same
- 19 fiscal year, an equivalent number of days included as [a] state
- 20 holidays under Sections 662.003(b)(1) through (4) [holiday] that:
- 21 (A) <u>do</u> [does] not fall on a Saturday or Sunday;
- 22 and
- 23 (B) the General Appropriations Act does not
- 24 prohibit state agencies from observing[; and
- 25 [(3) the General Appropriations Act does not prohibit
- 26 state agencies from observing the optional holiday].
- 27 SECTION 7. Section 662.021, Government Code, is amended to
