A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to a pilot project to provide emergency telemedicine
- 3 medical services and telehealth services in rural areas.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 771, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subchapter F to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER F. NEXT GENERATION 9-1-1 TELEMEDICINE MEDICAL SERVICES
- 8 <u>AND TELEHEALTH SERVICES PILOT PROJECT</u>
- 9 Sec. 771.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 10 (1) "Center" means the area health education center at
- 11 the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center that meets the
- 12 requirements of 42 U.S.C. Section 294a and has been awarded federal
- 13 <u>funding as an area health education center.</u>
- 14 (2) "Emergency medical services" means services used
- 15 to respond to an individual's perceived need for immediate medical
- 16 care and to prevent death or aggravation of physiological or
- 17 psychological illness or injury.
- 18 (3) "Emergency medical services provider" means a
- 19 person who uses or maintains emergency medical services vehicles,
- 20 medical equipment, and emergency medical services personnel to
- 21 provide emergency medical services.
- 22 (4) "Emergency prehospital care" means care provided
- 23 to a sick or injured individual before or during transportation of
- 24 the individual to a medical facility, and includes any necessary

- 1 stabilization of the individual in connection with that
- 2 transportation.
- 3 (5) "Pilot project" means a pilot project established
- 4 under Section 771.152.
- 5 (6) "Regional trauma resource center" means a trauma
- 6 facility the center selects to participate in the pilot project.
- 7 <u>(7) "Rural area" means:</u>
- 8 (A) a county with a population of 50,000 or less;
- 9 or
- 10 (B) a large, isolated, and sparsely populated
- 11 area of a county with a population of more than 50,000.
- 12 (8) "Telehealth service" and "telemedicine medical
- 13 service" have the meanings assigned by Section 111.001, Occupations
- 14 Code.
- 15 (9) "Trauma facility" means a health care facility
- 16 equipped and staffed to provide comprehensive treatment of
- 17 seriously injured individuals as part of an emergency medical
- 18 services and trauma care system.
- 19 Sec. 771.152. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROJECT. (a) The
- 20 commission, with the assistance of the center, shall establish a
- 21 pilot project to provide emergency medical services instruction and
- 22 <u>emergency prehospital care instruction through a telemedicine</u>
- 23 medical service or telehealth service provided by regional trauma
- 24 resource centers to:
- 25 (1) health care providers in rural area trauma
- 26 facilities; and
- 27 (2) emergency medical services providers in rural

- 1 <u>areas.</u>
- 2 (b) The commission shall provide technical assistance to
- 3 the center in implementing the pilot project.
- 4 (c) The center, with the assistance of the commission,
- 5 shall:
- 6 (1) design criteria and protocols for each
- 7 <u>telemedicine medical service or telehealth service offered and the</u>
- 8 related instruction, and provide the oversight necessary to conduct
- 9 the pilot project;
- 10 (2) define criteria to determine when a telemedicine
- 11 medical service or telehealth service that provides instruction for
- 12 emergency medical services, emergency prehospital care, and trauma
- 13 care should be transferred to an emergency medical resource center
- 14 for intervention; and
- 15 (3) collect the data necessary to evaluate the
- 16 project.
- 17 (d) The center may make available appropriate resources for
- 18 individuals who do not speak English.
- 19 Sec. 771.153. PERSONNEL. The center shall provide the
- 20 telemedicine medical service or telehealth service and related
- 21 instruction for the pilot project through health care providers in
- 22 regional trauma resource centers, including physicians,
- 23 pharmacists, emergency medical personnel, and other health
- 24 professionals.
- Sec. 771.154. PARTICIPATION IN PILOT PROJECT. (a) The
- 26 center shall determine the trauma facilities and emergency medical
- 27 services providers interested in participating in the pilot

- 1 project.
- 2 (b) A trauma facility or emergency medical services
- 3 provider participating in the pilot project must agree to
- 4 successfully complete any required training and to provide all
- 5 reports required by the center for the project.
- 6 Sec. 771.155. SELECTION OF PILOT PROJECT PARTICIPANTS AND
- 7 REGIONAL TRAUMA RESOURCE CENTERS. (a) The center, with the
- 8 assistance of the commission, may select trauma facilities and
- 9 emergency medical services providers to participate in the pilot
- 10 project and select trauma facilities to serve as regional trauma
- 11 resource centers.
- 12 (b) The center may not select a trauma facility to
- 13 participate in the pilot project or to serve as a regional trauma
- 14 resource center unless the facility:
- 15 (1) has a quality assurance program that measures each
- 16 <u>health care provider's compliance with the medical protocol;</u>
- 17 (2) uses emergency medical services and emergency
- 18 prehospital care protocols approved by a physician medical director
- 19 knowledgeable in emergency medical services and emergency
- 20 prehospital care;
- 21 (3) has experience in providing emergency medical
- 22 <u>services and emergency prehospital care</u> that the center determines
- 23 is sufficient; and
- 24 (4) has resources sufficient to provide the additional
- 25 telemedicine medical services or telehealth services and related
- 26 instruction required for the project in addition to the health care
- 27 services the facility already provides.

- 1 (c) In selecting a trauma facility to serve as a regional
- 2 trauma resource center, the center shall consider the facility
- 3 personnel's ability to maintain records and produce reports to
- 4 measure the effectiveness of the pilot project. The center shall
- 5 share information regarding that ability with the commission.
- 6 Sec. 771.156. FUNDING OF PILOT PROJECT. (a) Money
- 7 collected under Section 771.072(f) may be appropriated to the
- 8 commission to fund the pilot project.
- 9 (b) The center may seek grants to fund the pilot project.
- 10 (c) A political subdivision with a trauma facility that
- 11 participates in the pilot project may pay part of the project costs.
- 12 (d) If a sufficient number of political subdivisions in a
- 13 region that may be served by the pilot project agree to pay the
- 14 center an amount that together with other funding received under
- 15 this section is sufficient to fund the project for the region, the
- 16 <u>center shall:</u>
- 17 (1) contract with the political subdivisions for each
- 18 subdivision to pay an appropriate share of the cost; and
- 19 (2) implement the project for the region when the
- 20 amounts agreed to in the contracts and any other funding received
- 21 under this section are sufficient to fund the project for the
- 22 <u>region.</u>
- Sec. 771.157. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. The center, in
- 24 cooperation with the commission, shall report its findings to the
- 25 governor and the presiding officer of each house of the legislature
- 26 not later than December 31, 2028.
- Sec. 771.158. LIABILITY. The operations of the center and a

- 1 regional trauma resource center are considered to be the provision
- 2 of 9-1-1 services for purposes of Section 771.053. Employees of and
- 3 volunteers at the regional trauma resource center have the same
- 4 protection from liability as a member of the governing body of a
- 5 public agency under Section 771.053.
- 6 Sec. 771.159. PROJECT WORK GROUP. (a) The center may
- 7 appoint a project work group to assist the center in developing,
- 8 implementing, and evaluating the pilot project and preparing a
- 9 report on the center's findings.
- 10 (b) A member of the project work group is not entitled to
- 11 compensation for serving on the project work group and may not be
- 12 reimbursed for travel or other expenses incurred while conducting
- 13 the business of the project work group.
- 14 (c) The project work group is not subject to Chapter 2110,
- 15 Government Code.
- Sec. 771.160. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires
- 17 September 1, 2029.
- SECTION 2. Section 771.072(g), Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (g) Notwithstanding any other law, revenue derived from the
- 21 equalization surcharge imposed under this section may be
- 22 appropriated to the commission only for the purposes described by
- 23 <u>Section 771.156 and</u> Sections 773.122 through 773.124.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
