## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter M-2 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER M-2. STATEWIDE INTERAGENCY AGING SERVICES COORDINATING
8	COUNCIL
9	Sec. 531.491. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "council"
10	means the statewide interagency aging services coordinating
11	council.
12	Sec. 531.492. PURPOSE. The council is established to
13	ensure a strategic statewide approach to interagency aging
14	services.
15	Sec. 531.493. COMPOSITION OF COUNCIL. (a) Subject to
16	Subsection (b), the council is composed of at least one
17	representative designated by each of the following agencies and
18	<pre>entities:</pre>
19	(1) the governor's office;
20	(2) the commission, including one representative of
21	the commission's aging services coordination office;
22	(3) the Department of Family and Protective Services;
23	(4) the Department of State Health Services;
24	(5) the Department of Agriculture's office of rural

1 health; 2 (6) the Texas Veterans Commission; 3 (7) the Texas Workforce Commission; (8) the office of the attorney general; 4 5 (9) the Barshop Institute for Longevity and Aging Studies at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San 6 7 Antonio; (10) the Texas Aging and Longevity Center at The 8 University of Texas at Austin; and 10 (11) the Center for Population Health and Aging at 11 Texas A&M University. 12 (b) The executive commissioner shall determine the number of representatives that each agency or entity may designate to 13 14 serve on the council. 15 (c) The council may authorize another state agency or entity that provides specific interagency aging services with the use of 16 17 appropriated money to designate a representative to the council. (d) A council member serves at the pleasure of the 18 19 designating entity. Sec. 531.494. PRESIDING OFFICER. Sec. 531.495. MEETINGS. The council shall meet at least

once quarterly or more frequently at the call of the presiding

- 1 commissioner a five-year statewide interagency aging services
- 2 strategic plan;
- 3 (2) shall develop a biennial coordinated statewide
- 4 interagency aging services expenditure proposal;
- 5 (3) shall annually publish an updated inventory of
- 6 state-funded interagency aging programs and services that includes
- 7 a description of how those programs and services further the
- 8 purpose of the statewide interagency aging services strategic plan;
- 9 (4) may facilitate opportunities to increase
- 10 collaboration for the effective expenditure of available federal
- 11 and state money for interagency aging services in this state; and
- 12 (5) may establish subcommittees as necessary to carry
- 13 out the council's duties under this subchapter.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
