A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the salary and wages paid to public school employees;
3	making an appropriation.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 21.402, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (c-2), (c-3), and (d) and amending Subsection
7	(g) to read as follows:
8	(c-2) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), for the 2023-2024
9	school year, a classroom teacher, full-time librarian, full-time
10	school counselor certified under Subchapter B, or full-time school
11	nurse is entitled to a monthly salary that is at least equal to the
12	sum of:
13	(1) the monthly salary the employee would have
14	received for the 2023-2024 school year under the district's salary
15	schedule for the 2022-2023 school year, if that schedule had been in
16	effect for the 2023-2024 school year, including any local
17	supplement and any money representing a career ladder supplement
18	the employee would have received in the 2023-2024 school year; and
19	<u>(2) \$400.</u>
20	(c-3) Subsection (c-2) and this subsection expire September
21	<u>1, 2024.</u>
22	(d) A classroom teacher, full-time librarian, full-time
23	school counselor certified under Subchapter B, or full-time school
24	nurse employed by a school district in the 2023-2024 school year is,

- 1 as long as the employee is employed by the same district, entitled
- 2 to a salary that is at least equal to the salary the employee
- 3 received for the 2023-2024 school year.
- 4 (g) The commissioner may adopt rules to govern the
- 5 application of this section, including rules that:
- 6 (1) require the payment of a minimum salary under this
- 7 section to a person employed in more than one capacity for which a
- 8 minimum salary is provided and whose combined employment in those
- 9 capacities constitutes full-time employment; and
- 10 (2) specify the credentials a person must hold to be
- 11 considered a [speech pathologist or] school nurse under this
- 12 section.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 48.2521 to read as follows:
- Sec. 48.2521. ADDITIONAL STATE AID FOR SALARY INCREASES FOR
- 16 CERTAIN PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYEES. (a) A school district, including
- 17 a school district that is otherwise ineligible for state aid under
- 18 this chapter, is entitled to state aid in an amount equal to the
- 19 product of \$4,000 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers,
- 20 full-time librarians, full-time school counselors certified under
- 21 Subchapter B, Chapter 21, and full-time school nurses employed by
- 22 the district.
- 23 (b) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this
- 24 section.
- 25 SECTION 3. (a) The amount of \$1 billion is appropriated
- 26 from the economic stabilization fund to the foundation school fund
- 27 for distribution by the commissioner of education during the state

- 1 fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, to school districts to
- 2 provide one-time retention bonuses to district support staff.
- 3 (b) The commissioner of education shall distribute the
- 4 amount appropriated under this section to school districts on the
- 5 basis of the number of full-time district employees, other than
- 6 administrators and employees subject to the minimum salary schedule
- 7 under Section 21.402, Education Code.
- 8 (c) Each school district may use funds distributed under
- 9 this section only to increase the salary that would otherwise be
- 10 provided to district employees described by Subsection (b) of this
- 11 section.
- 12 (d) This section takes effect only if this Act is approved
- 13 by a vote of two-thirds of the members present in each house of the
- 14 legislature, as provided by Section 49-g(m), Article III, Texas
- 15 Constitution.
- SECTION 4. Section 21.402(c-1), Education Code, is
- 17 repealed.
- SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 19 school year.
- 20 SECTION 6. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
