- 5 SECTION 1. Section 660.113(c), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (c) Except as provided by Section 660.1135, a [A] state
- 8 agency may not reimburse a state employee for a meal expense
- 9 incurred within the employee's designated headquarters unless the
- 10 expense is:
- 11 (1) mandatory; and
- 12 (2) connected with training, a seminar, or a
- 13 conference.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 660, Government Code, is
- 15 amended by adding Section 660.1135 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 660.1135. REIMBURSEMENT FOR GROCERIES PURCHASED
- 17 WITHIN EMPLOYEE'S DESIGNATED HEADQUARTERS. (a) In this section,
- 18 "groceries" means food items sold at a grocery store, supermarket,
- 19 <u>or other similar retail establishment.</u>
- 20 <u>(b) A state agency may reimburse a state employee as</u>
- 21 provided by Subsections (c) and (d) for groceries purchased within
- 22 the employee's designated headquarters if:
- 23 (1) the purchase is made the day before or the day the
- 24 employee travels to conduct official state business; and

- 1 (2) the groceries are consumed by the employee while
- 2 the employee is away from the employee's designated headquarters
- 3 <u>traveling for official state business.</u>
- 4 (c) A state agency may only reimburse a state employee under
- 5 this section for the prorated portion of groceries consumed each
- 6 day by the state employee while traveling for official state
- 7 business.
- 8 (d) A purchase made under this section is considered a meal
- 9 expense for purposes of determining the limit established by the
- 10 travel provisions of the General Appropriations Act for meal
- 11 expenses under Section 660.112.
- 12 (e) A state agency must develop a policy for authorizing
- 13 reimbursements under this section before the agency may reimburse a
- 14 state employee under this section.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
