A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the licensing of certain persons as peace officers by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement and the hiring of those 3 persons by political subdivisions. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 370, Local Government 6 7 Code, is amended to read as follows: CHAPTER 370. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS RELATING TO [MUNICIPAL AND 8 COUNTY] HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY OF MORE THAN ONE TYPE OF LOCAL 9 10 GOVERNMENT 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 370, Local Government Code, is amended 12 by adding Section 370.007 to read as follows: Sec. 370.007. APPOINTING OR EMPLOYING CERTAIN LEGAL 13 PERMANENT RESIDENTS AS PEACE OFFICERS. (a) In this section, 14 "commission" means the <u>Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.</u> 15 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a political subdivision 16 that appoints or employs peace officers may appoint or employ as a 17 peace officer a legal permanent resident of the United States if the 18 person submits an affidavit to the political subdivision in a form 19 prescribed by the commission affirming the person's intent to apply 20 for United States citizenship not later than six months after the 21 date the person becomes eligible to do so. 22 23 SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is

24 amended by adding Section 1701.3095 to read as follows:

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Sec. 1701.3095. LICENSING OF 1 LEGAL PERMANENT RESIDENTS. (a) The commission shall issue a peace officer license 2 to a person who is a legal permanent resident of the United States 3 if the person meets the requirements of this chapter and the 4 5 commission's rules for the license. 6 (b) The commission shall prescribe a form for a person who 7 is a legal permanent resident of the United States to affirm the person's intent to apply for United States citizenship not later 8

9 than six months after the date the person becomes eligible to do so.

SECTION 4. Section 1701.451(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

12 (a) Before a law enforcement agency may hire a person 13 licensed under this chapter, the agency must, on a form and in the 14 manner prescribed by the commission:

(1) obtain the person's written consent for the agency to review the information required to be reviewed under this section;

18 (2) request from the commission and any other
19 applicable person information required to be reviewed under this
20 section; and

(3) submit to the commission confirmation that the agency, to the best of the agency's ability before hiring the person:

(A) contacted each entity or individual
 necessary to obtain the information required to be reviewed under
 this section; and

27 (B) except as provided by Subsection (b),

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1 obtained and reviewed as related to the person, as applicable: 2 (i) personnel files and other employee 3 records from each previous law enforcement agency employer, including the employment application submitted to the previous 4 5 employer; 6 (ii) employment termination reports 7 maintained by the commission under this subchapter; (iii) service records maintained by the 8 9 commission; 10 (iv) proof that the person meets the minimum qualifications for enrollment in a training program under 11 Section 1701.251(a); 12 (v) a military veteran's United States 13 14 Department of Defense Form DD-214 or other military discharge 15 record; 16 (vi) criminal history record information; 17 (vii) information on pending warrants as available through the Texas Crime Information Center and National 18 Crime Information Center; 19 20 (viii) evidence of financial responsibility as required by Section 601.051, Transportation 21 22 Code; 23 (ix) a driving record from the Department 24 of Public Safety; 25 (x) proof of United States citizenship or, 26 if the person is a peace officer, proof of legal permanent residence and an affidavit affirming the person's intent to apply for United 27

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States citizenship not later than six months after the date the person becomes eligible to do so; and

3 (xi) information on the person's background 4 from at least three personal references and at least two 5 professional references.

6 SECTION 5. Not later than December 1, 2023, the Texas 7 Commission on Law Enforcement shall amend rules as necessary to 8 comply with Section 1701.3095, Occupations Code, as added by this 9 Act, and Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, as amended by this 10 Act.

SECTION 6. Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to the hiring of a person by a law enforcement agency that occurs on or after December 1, 2023. The hiring of a person by a law enforcement agency that occurs before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
