A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to measures to assist students enrolled at public
- 3 institutions of higher education who are homeless or who are or were
- 4 in foster care.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 51.9356, Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 51.9356. DESIGNATION OF LIAISON OFFICER TO ASSIST
- 9 STUDENTS WHO ARE OR WERE IN FOSTER CARE OR WHO ARE HOMELESS. (a) In
- 10 this section:
- 11 (1) "Institution[, "institution] of higher education"
- 12 has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
- 13 (2) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 14 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 15 Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student
- 16 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
- 17 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
- 18 <u>terms.</u>
- 19 (b) Each institution of higher education shall designate at
- 20 least one employee of the institution to act as a liaison officer
- 21 for current and incoming:
- 22 (1) students [at the institution] who are or were
- 23 [formerly] in the conservatorship of the Department of Family and
- 24 Protective Services; and

- 1 (2) students who are homeless.
- 2 <u>(c)</u> To the extent allowed by state or federal law, <u>an</u> [the]
- 3 institution of higher education shall identify [those] students
- 4 described by Subsection (b)(1), and make best efforts to identify
- 5 <u>students described by Subsection (b)(2)</u>, from information provided
- 6 to the institution in admission or financial aid applications or
- 7 other available resources.
- 8 (d) An institution of higher education may designate under
- 9 Subsection (b) the same employee or employees to act as liaison
- 10 officer for each student described in that subsection or one or more
- 11 different employees to act as liaison officer for each of those
- 12 students separately.
- (e) $[\frac{(c)}{(c)}]$ Each semester or other academic term, an
- 14 institution of higher education shall provide to the institution's
- 15 liaison officer or officers the names of and information regarding
- 16 the students described by Subsection (b) for whom the officer is
- 17 designated.
- 18 (f) A [(d) The] liaison officer shall provide to the
- 19 students described by Subsection (b) for whom the officer is
- 20 <u>designated</u> information regarding support services <u>including</u>
- 21 financial aid, on-campus and off-campus housing, food and meal
- 22 programs, and counseling services, [and] other resources available
- 23 to the students at the institution of higher education, and any
- 24 other relevant information to assist the students.
- 25 (g) A [(e) The] liaison officer may participate in any
- 26 training that enables the officer to carry out the officer's duties
- 27 and coordinate with liaison officers at other educational

- 2 (h) [(f)] Each institution of higher education shall
- 3 publicize, including through the institution's Internet website,
- 4 social media, electronic mail, or other means of communication used
- 5 by the institution:
- 6 (1) the name of and contact information for the
- 7 institution's liaison officer or officers; and
- 8 (2) information regarding support services and other
- 9 resources available at the institution to the students described by
- 10 Subsection (b).
- 11 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 51.978, Education Code,
- 12 is amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 51.978. TEMPORARY HOUSING BETWEEN ACADEMIC TERMS FOR
- 14 CERTAIN STUDENTS WHO WERE [FORMERLY] UNDER CONSERVATORSHIP OF
- 15 DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES OR WHO ARE HOMELESS.
- SECTION 3. Section 51.978(a), Education Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subdivision (3) to read as follows:
- 18 (3) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 19 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 20 Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student
- 21 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
- 22 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
- 23 terms.
- SECTION 4. Section 51.978(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (b) To be eligible to receive housing assistance from an
- 27 institution of higher education under Subsection (c), a student

- 1 must: 2 (1)be: 3 (A) a student who has [have] been under the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services 4 5 or its predecessor in function on the day preceding: 6 (i) $[\frac{A}{A}]$ the student's 18th birthday; or (ii) [(B)] the 7 date the 8 disabilities of minority are removed by a court under Chapter 31, Family Code; or 9
- 10 (B) a student who is homeless;
- 11 (2) be enrolled full-time at the institution during 12 the academic term immediately preceding the period for which the 13 student requests the housing assistance;
- 14 (3) be registered or otherwise have taken the actions 15 required by the institution to permit the student to enroll 16 full-time at the institution during the academic term immediately 17 following the period for which the student requests the housing 18 assistance; and
- (4) lack other reasonable temporary housing alternatives between the academic terms described by Subdivisions (2) and (3), as determined by the institution.
- 22 SECTION 5. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is 23 amended by adding Section 51.9781 to read as follows:
- 24 <u>Sec. 51.9781. PRIORITY ACCESS TO STUDENT HOUSING FOR</u>
 25 STUDENTS WHO ARE HOMELESS. (a) In this section:
- 26 (1) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning 27 assigned by Section 61.003.

- 1 (2) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 2 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 3 <u>Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student</u>
- 4 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
- 5 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
- 6 terms.
- 7 (b) Each institution of higher education that maintains
- 8 student housing facilities may give priority in the assignment of
- 9 housing in those facilities to students who are homeless in
- 10 accordance with priorities established in the institution's
- 11 housing policy.
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 61.0908, Education Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 61.0908. DESIGNATION OF LIAISON OFFICER TO ASSIST
- 15 STUDENTS WHO WERE [FORMERLY] IN FOSTER CARE OR WHO ARE HOMELESS.
- 16 (a) In this section, "students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 17 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 18 Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student
- 19 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
- 20 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
- 21 terms.
- 22 <u>(b)</u> The board shall designate at least one employee of the
- 23 board to act as a liaison officer for the following current and
- 24 incoming students at institutions of higher education:
- 25 (1) students who were formerly in the conservatorship
- 26 of the Department of Family and Protective Services; and
- 27 (2) students who are homeless.

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- 1 (c) The board may designate under Subsection (b) the same
- 2 employee or employees to act as liaison officer for each student
- 3 described in that subsection or one or more different employees to
- 4 act as liaison officer for each of those students separately. A
- 5 $[\frac{\text{The}}{\text{The}}]$ liaison officer shall assist the students for whom the
- 6 officer is designated in coordinating college readiness and student
- 7 success efforts relating to the [those] students.
- 8 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 9 beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.
- 10 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
