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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to inspections and examinations by the Railroad Commission of Texas of certain sites and facilities conducted using unmanned 3 aircraft. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 423.002(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 It is lawful to capture an image using an unmanned 8 (a) aircraft in this state: 9 (1) for the purpose of professional or scholarly 10 research and development or for another academic purpose by a 11 person acting on behalf of an institution of higher education or a 12 private or independent institution of higher education, as those 13 terms are defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, including a 14 15 person who: is a professor, employee, or student of the 16 (A) institution; or 17 18 (B) is under contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of the institution; 19 20 (2) in airspace designated as a test site or range 21 authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration for the purpose of integrating unmanned aircraft systems into the national 22 23 airspace; 24 (3) as part of an operation, exercise, or mission of

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1 any branch of the United States military;

2 (4) if the image is captured by a satellite for the3 purposes of mapping;

4 (5) if the image is captured by or for an electric or5 natural gas utility or a telecommunications provider:

(A) for operations and maintenance of utility or
7 telecommunications facilities for the purpose of maintaining
8 utility or telecommunications system reliability and integrity;

9 (B) for inspecting utility or telecommunications 10 facilities to determine repair, maintenance, or replacement needs 11 during and after construction of such facilities;

12 (C) for assessing vegetation growth for the 13 purpose of maintaining clearances on utility or telecommunications 14 easements; and

(D) for utility or telecommunications facility routing and siting for the purpose of providing utility or telecommunications service;

(6) with the consent of the individual who owns or
lawfully occupies the real property captured in the image;

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(7) pursuant to a valid search or arrest warrant;

(8) if the image is captured by a law enforcement authority or a person who is under contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of a law enforcement authority:

(A) in immediate pursuit of a person law
enforcement officers have reasonable suspicion or probable cause to
suspect has committed an offense, not including misdemeanors or
offenses punishable by a fine only;

No. 1302 for the purpose of documenting a crime scene 1 (B) where an offense, not including misdemeanors or offenses punishable 2 3 by a fine only, has been committed; 4 (C) for the purpose of investigating the scene 5 of: 6 (i) a human fatality; 7 (ii) a motor vehicle accident causing death 8 or serious bodily injury to a person; or 9 (iii) any motor vehicle accident on a state 10 highway or federal interstate or highway; in connection with the search for a missing 11 (D) 12 person; (E) for the purpose of conducting a high-risk 13 14 tactical operation that poses a threat to human life; 15 (F) of private property that is generally open to the public where the property owner consents to law enforcement 16 public safety responsibilities; or 17 (G) of real property or a person on real property 18 that is within 25 miles of the United States border for the sole 19 purpose of ensuring border security; 20 21 if the image is captured by state or local law (9) enforcement authorities, or a person who is under contract with or 22 otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of state 23 24 authorities, for the purpose of: 25 (A) surveying the scene of a catastrophe or other 26 damage to determine whether a state of emergency should be 27 declared;

No. 1302 1 (B) preserving public safety, protecting property, or surveying damage or contamination during a lawfully 2 3 declared state of emergency; or (C) conducting routine air quality sampling and 4 5 monitoring, as provided by state or local law; (10)at the scene of a spill, or a suspected spill, of 6 7 hazardous materials; 8 (11)for the purpose of fire suppression; 9 for the purpose of rescuing a person whose life or (12)10 well-being is in imminent danger; if the image is captured by a Texas licensed real 11 (13)12 estate broker in connection with the marketing, sale, or financing of real property, provided that no individual is identifiable in 13 14 the image; 15 (14)from a height no more than eight feet above ground 16 level in a public place, if the image was captured without using any 17 electronic, mechanical, or other means to amplify the image beyond normal human perception; 18 19 (15) of public real property or a person on that 20 property; 21 (16)if the image is captured by the owner or operator of an oil, gas, water, or other pipeline for the purpose of 22 23 inspecting, maintaining, or repairing pipelines or other related 24 facilities, and is captured without the intent to conduct surveillance on an individual or real property located in this 25 26 state: 27 (17)in connection with oil pipeline safety and rig

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1 protection;

2 (18) in connection with port authority surveillance3 and security;

4 (19) if the image is captured by a registered 5 professional land surveyor in connection with the practice of 6 professional surveying, as those terms are defined by Section 7 1071.002, Occupations Code, provided that no individual is 8 identifiable in the image;

9 (20) if the image is captured by a professional 10 engineer licensed under Subchapter G, Chapter 1001, Occupations 11 Code, in connection with the practice of engineering, as defined by 12 Section 1001.003, Occupations Code, provided that no individual is 13 identifiable in the image; [or]

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(21) if:

(A) the image is captured by an employee of an insurance company or of an affiliate of the company in connection with the underwriting of an insurance policy, or the rating or adjusting of an insurance claim, regarding real property or a structure on real property; and

20 (B) the operator of the unmanned aircraft is 21 authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration to conduct operations within the airspace from which the image is captured; or 22 23 (22) if the image is captured by the Railroad 24 Commission of Texas or an agent, servant, or employee of the commission in connection with the inspection and examination of: 25 26 (A) an oil or gas site or facility, including a 27 well, tank, or disposal or injection site;

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1	(B) a pipeline facility; or
2	(C) a surface mining site.
3	SECTION 2. Section 88.091, Natural Resources Code, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	Sec. 88.091. ACCESS TO PROPERTY AND RECORDS. The
6	governmental agency shall have access at all times to:
7	(1) the oil property of all persons for inspection and
8	examination, including for inspection and examination by unmanned
9	<u>aircraft</u> ; and
10	(2) the records of all these persons for inspection,
11	examination, and audit.
12	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
13	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
14	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
15	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
16	Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
