3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 66.020(b) and (c), Parks and Wildlife
5	Code, are amended to read as follows:
6	(b) This section applies to the possession, transportation,
7	sale, or purchase of any fish described by Subsection (a) without
8	regard to where the fish was taken, caught, or raised, but does not
9	apply to:
10	(1) the transportation or possession of fish taken,
11	caught, or raised outside this state and transported by common
12	carrier without being unloaded from outside this state to a point of
13	delivery outside this state;
14	(2) fish raised by being continuously fed a prepared
15	feed and sold by an operator of a Texas commercial aquaculture
16	facility, as defined by Section 134.001, Agriculture Code; [ <del>or</del> ]
17	(3) the sale of fish described by Subdivision (2) by:
18	(A) a licensed wholesale fish dealer;
19	(B) a licensed retail fish dealer; or
20	(C) a restaurant;
21	(4) bass of the genus Micropterus and crappie if the
22	fish are:
23	(A) reared in private water; and
24	(B) sold by an operator of a Texas commercial

H.B. No. 1333 aquaculture facility for the purpose of stocking: 1 2 (i) water of the state under a permit required under Section 66.015(b); or 3 4 (ii) private water with the documentation 5 required under Section 134.018, Agriculture Code; or 6 (5) the lawful importation by the holder of a Texas 7 finfish import license into this state from another state or 8 foreign country or the exclusive economic zone of farm-raised red drum, bass of the genus Micropterus, crappie, flathead catfish, 9 10 striped bass, white bass, or a hybrid of any of those fish that have been continuously fed a prepared feed as a primary food source or 11 12 lawfully taken, caught, or raised blue marlin, jewfish, longbill spearfish, muskellunge, northern pike, sailfish, sauger, snook, 13 14 spotted sea trout, tarpon, walleye, white marlin, yellow bass, or a 15 hybrid of any of those fish, if the fish are [transported or sold when not alive and are] tagged, invoiced, packaged, and labeled 16 17 under regulations of the commission and if the license holder complies with any requirements the commission may establish by 18 proclamation that the fish enter the stream of commerce for sale in 19 this state in a condition allowing ready identification of the 20 species, including a requirement that the fish come into the state 21 with the head and tail intact and tagged and a requirement that an 22 invoice accompany all imported fish regulated by this section 23 24 through each sales transaction, including transactions at the place of the final sale to the consumer. 25 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b)(5) [(b)(3) of this 26

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section], the commission may allow subsequent sale of lawfully

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imported fish without the head and tail intact and without a tag if the fish are labeled in a manner prescribed by the commission and the tag when removed is destroyed. A tag, if required, must be of a type prescribed by the commission and shall be sold to an applicant at a cost as determined by the commission that is reasonable to defray the administrative costs incurred in connection with the tag requirement.

8 SECTION 2. Sections 66.111(a) and (b), Parks and Wildlife 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:

10 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), no person may buy 11 or offer to buy, sell or offer to sell, possess for the purpose of 12 sale, transport or ship for the purpose of sale, or barter or 13 exchange[+

14 [(1) freshwater crappie, bass of the genus 15 Micropterus, striped bass and hybrids of striped bass, white bass, 16 walleye, sauger, northern pike, muskellunge, trout of the family 17 Salmonidae, flathead catfish; or

18 [(2)] any [other] fish taken from the public fresh 19 water of this state.

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(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to:

(1) [a fish, other than a bass of the genus Micropterus, reared in private water by an operator of a commercial aquaculture facility, as defined by Section 134.001, Agriculture Code;

25 [(2) a fish possessed legally outside this state and 26 transported into this state;

27 [(3) bass of the genus Micropterus reared in private

1	water by an operator of a commercial aquaculture facility, as
2	defined by Section 134.001, Agriculture Code, and marketed for the
3	purpose of stocking the water of this state;
4	[ <del>(4)</del> ] nongame fish regulated under Chapter 67 [ <del>of this</del>
5	<del>code</del> ]; or
6	<u>(2)</u> [ <del>(5)</del> ] channel catfish of more than 14 inches in
7	length or blue catfish of more than 14 inches in length taken from
8	the public fresh water of Angelina, Bowie, Camp, Cass, Chambers,
9	Franklin, Freestone, Gregg, Hardin, Harris, Harrison, Jasper,
10	Jefferson, Lamar, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Marion, Montgomery,
11	Morris, Nacogdoches, Navarro, Newton, Orange, Panola, Polk, Red
12	River, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Titus, Trinity,
13	Tyler, Upshur, or Walker County, the public fresh water of the
14	Neches or Trinity River in Houston County, the public fresh water of
15	the Colorado River in Bastrop, Colorado, Fayette, Matagorda, or
16	Wharton County, or the public fresh water of Falcon Lake in Starr or

17 Zapata County.

SECTION 3. Section 66.2012(e), Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:

(e) This section does not apply to activities that are
regulated under the exceptions provided by Subdivisions (1), (2),
and (5) [(3)] of Section 66.020(b) or under Subsections (f) and (g)
of that section.

24 SECTION 4. Section 66.111(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 25 repealed.

26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
