5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 155, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 155.108 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 155.108. LICENSE FOR MILITARY VETERAN TO PRACTICE IN
8	CERTAIN AREAS. (a) In this section, "active duty" and "armed
9	forces of the United States" have the meanings assigned by Section
10	<u>55.001.</u>
11	(b) The board shall issue a license to practice medicine in
12	a location described by Subsection (e) to an applicant who:
13	(1) is licensed in good standing as a physician in
14	another state;
15	(2) is a veteran of the armed forces of the United
16	States who retired from or otherwise left military service not more
17	than one year before the application date for a license under this
18	section; and
19	(3) was, at the time of retiring from or leaving
20	military service:
21	(A) serving on active duty in this state; and
22	(B) authorized as a physician to treat persons
23	enlisted in the armed forces of the United States or veterans.
24	(c) An applicant for a license under this section is not

- 20 (e) A physician licensed under this section may practice

- SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Section 301.262 to read as follows:

Sec. 301.262. LICENSE FOR MILITARY VETERAN TO PRACTICE IN 1 CERTAIN AREAS. (a) In this section, "active duty" and "armed 2 forces of the United States" have the meanings assigned by Section 3 4 55.001. 5 (b) The board shall issue a license to practice nursing in a location described by Subsection (e) to an applicant who: 6 7 (1) is licensed in good standing as a nurse in another 8 state; (2) is a veteran of the armed forces of the United 9 States who retired from or otherwise left military service not more 10 than one year before the application date for a license under this 11 12 section; and (3) was, at the time of retiring from or otherwise 13 14 leaving military service: 15 (A) serving on active duty in this state; and 16 (B) authorized as a nurse to treat persons 17 enlisted in the armed forces of the United States or veterans. (c) An applicant for a license under this section is not 18 19 required to have passed the jurisprudence examination. (e) A nurse licensed under this section may practice only 10 11 in: 12 (1) a health professional shortage area, as defined by Section 157.051; or 13 14 (2) a medically underserved community, as defined by 15 Section 487.201, Government Code. 16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
