1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to Medicaid reimbursement for certain medication-assisted
1-20 treatments for opioid or substance use disorder.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section [32.03115\(e\)](#), Human Resources Code, is
1-23 repealed.

1-24 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
1-25 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
1-26 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
1-27 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
1-28 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
1-29 waiver or authorization is granted.

1-30 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-31 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-32 provided by Section [39](#), Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-33 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-34 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
