13	programs under Subchapter A, Chapter 29;
14	(3) identify how the campus goals will be met for each
15	student;
16	(4) determine the resources needed to implement the
17	plan;
18	(5) identify staff needed to implement the plan;
19	(6) set timelines for reaching the goals;
20	(7) measure progress toward the performance
21	objectives periodically to ensure that the plan is resulting in
22	academic improvement;
