- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1305.157, Occupations Code, is amended
- to read as follows:
- Sec. 1305.157. RESIDENTIAL WIREMAN. An applicant for a 7
- license as a residential wireman must: 8
- 9 (1) either:
- (A) have at least 4,000 hours of on-the-job 10
- training under the supervision of a master electrician or 11
- 12 residential wireman; or
- (B) successfully complete a career and 13
- 14 technology education program described by Section 1305.1575; and
- (2) pass a 15 residential wireman examination
- 16 administered under this chapter.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 1305, Occupations Code, is 17
- amended by adding Section 1305.1575 to read as follows: 18
- Sec. 1305.1575. CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR 19
- RESIDENTIAL WIREMAN LICENSE; INSTRUCTORS. (a) In this section: 20
- 21 (1) "Career and technology education program" means:
- 22 (A) a career and technology education program
- 23 under Subchapter F, Chapter 29, Education Code; or
- 24 (B) a program determined by the department to be

- 1 similar to that described by Paragraph (A) and offered by:
- 2 (i) an institution of higher education; or
- 3 (ii) a private school, as defined by
- 4 Section 5.001, Education Code.
- 5 (2) "Institution of higher education" means an
- 6 institution of higher education or a private or independent
- 7 institution of higher education, as those terms are defined by
- 8 Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 9 (b) A person who successfully completes a sequence of
- 10 courses in the electrical trade that are offered through a career
- 11 and technology education program may apply for and take an
- 12 examination for a license as a residential wireman, regardless of
- 13 whether the person has completed the number of hours of on-the-job
- 14 training required by Section 1305.157(1).
- 15 (c) The commission by rule shall establish standards for the
- 16 <u>essential knowledge and skills of a career and technology education</u>
- 17 program described by Subsection (b), subject to the approval of the
- 18 State Board of Education if the courses are to be offered in a high
- 19 school. The rules must:
- 20 (1) require the program to consist of an appropriate
- 21 number of hours of classroom instruction and a practical component;
- 22 <u>and</u>
- 23 (2) provide for crediting appropriate on-the-job
- 24 training toward meeting the requirements of the practical
- 25 component.
- 26 (d) A student of any age enrolled in a career and technology
- 27 education program is eligible to take the sequence of courses

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- 1 described by Subsection (b) without being licensed under this
- 2 chapter. This subsection does not authorize a person to perform
- 3 electrical work without the appropriate license outside of a
- 4 program described by this section.
- 5 (e) A person may not provide instruction in a program
- 6 <u>described by this section unless the person is licensed as a master</u>
- 7 <u>electrician</u>, journeyman electrician, or residential wireman.
- 8 (f) A career and technology education program offered under
- 9 this section by an institution of higher education may not be more
- 10 stringent than a program offered by a public high school.
- 11 (g) Hours spent completing a program described by this
- 12 section may not be credited toward any on-the-job training required
- 13 to apply for a license under this chapter.
- 14 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 1305.167, Occupations
- 15 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 1305.167. LICENSE RENEWAL; FEE EXEMPTION.
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 1305.167, Occupations Code, is amended
- 18 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 19 (d) A license holder who provides instruction in a career
- 20 and technology education program described by Section 1305.1575 is
- 21 not required to pay a fee to renew the license.
- 22 SECTION 5. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 23 of this Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall
- 24 adopt rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this
- 25 Act to Chapter 1305, Occupations Code.
- 26 SECTION 6. In developing the initial standards for the
- 27 career and technology education program under Section

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- 1 1305.1575(c), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, the Texas
- 2 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall consult with the Texas
- 3 State Technical College and relevant interest groups in the
- 4 electrical industry.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
