H.B. No. 1400

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the establishment of outpatient treatment programs to  
3 provide court-ordered outpatient mental health services in certain  
4 counties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 574, Health and Safety  
7 Code, is amended by adding Sections 574.038 and 574.039 to read as  
8 follows:

9 Sec. 574.038. ESTABLISHMENT OF REGIONAL ASSISTED  
10 OUTPATIENT TREATMENT PROGRAMS. The commissioners courts of two or  
11 more counties may establish a regional assisted outpatient  
12 treatment program to provide court-ordered outpatient mental  
13 health services under this chapter in the participating counties.

14 Sec. 574.039. MANDATORY PROGRAM IN CERTAIN COUNTIES. (a)  
15 Subject to Subsection (b), the commissioners court of a county with  
16 a population of more than 200,000 shall establish a program to  
17 provide court-ordered outpatient mental health services under this  
18 chapter and apply for federal and state funding to pay the program  
19 costs. The criminal justice division of the governor's office may  
20 assist a county in applying for federal funding.

21 (b) A county is required to establish a program to provide  
22 court-ordered outpatient mental health services under this chapter  
23 only if the county receives federal or state funding specifically  
24 for that purpose in an amount sufficient to pay the program costs.

1        (c) A county that is required to establish a program to  
2 provide court-ordered outpatient mental health services under this  
3 chapter and fails to establish or to maintain that program is  
4 ineligible to receive grant funding from this state or any state  
5 agency.

6        SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
10 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
