- 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 511, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Section 511.024 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 511.024. FAMILY LIAISON OFFICER. (a) The commission
- 7 shall require the sheriff of a county to designate at least one
- 8 employee at the county jail to serve as a family liaison officer for
- 9 the jail to facilitate communication between prisoners and their
- 10 families.
- 11 (b) In making a designation under Subsection (a), the
- 12 sheriff shall give preference to current employees with experience
- 13 <u>in social work, psychology, or a related field.</u>
- 14 (c) A family liaison officer shall:
- 15 (1) on request, provide prisoners' families with
- 16 information about the classification status, confinement status,
- 17 and health of prisoners at the county jail;
- 18 <u>(2) notify prisoners' families within a reasonable</u>
- 19 time about emergencies involving prisoners, such as a medical
- 20 <u>emergency or death; and</u>
- 21 (3) notify prisoners within a reasonable time about
- 22 <u>emergencies involving their families</u>, such as a medical emergency
- 23 or death in the family, and provide prisoners with other necessary
- 24 information relating to their families.

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- 1 (d) A family liaison officer may not disclose information
- 2 under Subsection (c) about a prisoner's health unless the prisoner
- 3 <u>has authorized the release of the prisoner's medical information to</u>
- 4 that family member.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
