6	SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 242, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 242.2015 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 242.2015. TRAINING REQUIREMENT FOR FACILITY PERSONNEL
9	PROVIDING ALZHEIMER'S CARE; PROHIBITED ADVERTISEMENT. A nursing
10	facility may not advertise, market, or otherwise promote the
11	facility's Alzheimer's care unit or memory care unit as providing
12	services to residents with Alzheimer's disease and related
13	disorders unless the facility provides the services through
14	specially trained personnel who have successfully completed a
15	minimum of four training hours in caring for those residents as
16	prescribed by commission rule.
17	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 247, Health and Safety
18	Code, is amended by adding Section 247.0297 to read as follows:
19	Sec. 247.0297. TRAINING REQUIREMENT FOR FACILITY PERSONNEL
20	PROVIDING ALZHEIMER'S CARE; PROHIBITED ADVERTISEMENT. An assisted
21	living facility may not advertise, market, or otherwise promote the
22	facility's Alzheimer's care unit or memory care unit as providing

- 4 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2023, the executive
- 5 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 6 adopt the rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by
- 7 this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 9 advertising, marketing, or promoting conducted on or after January
- 10 1, 2024.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
