A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to sickle cell disease health care improvement and the
3	sickle cell task force.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 533, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 533.0091 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 533.0091. SICKLE CELL DISEASE TREATMENT; HEALTH HOMES.
8	(a) In this section, "health home" means a primary care provider
9	or, if appropriate, a specialty care provider, incorporating into
10	patient care several features, including comprehensive care
11	coordination, family-centered care, and data management, that are
12	focused on improving outcome-based quality of care and increasing
13	patient and provider satisfaction.
14	(b) The commission shall:
15	(1) in collaboration with the sickle cell task force
16	established under Chapter 52, Health and Safety Code:
17	(A) ensure that health care services provided
18	under a managed care plan to recipients diagnosed with sickle cell
19	disease align with national clinical practice guidelines and
20	<pre>protocols for sickle cell disease treatment;</pre>
21	(B) consider using sickle cell clinical
22	evaluation and treatment guidelines, including those recommended
23	by the American Society of Hematology or the Children's Hospital of
24	Philadelphia; and

1	(C) increase sickle cell disease education for
2	Medicaid providers, including emergency room providers; and
3	(2) use the commission's Texas Healthcare Learning
4	Collaborative to identify opportunities for improving health
5	outcomes of recipients diagnosed with sickle cell disease by:
6	(A) reducing hospital admissions and
7	readmissions; and
8	(B) connecting those recipients to a sickle cell
9	disease health home or sickle cell disease expert.
10	(c) The commission shall establish one or more health homes
11	in this state for recipients diagnosed with sickle cell disease to:
12	(1) reduce barriers preventing recipients diagnosed
13	with sickle cell disease from receiving necessary health care;
14	(2) prevent unnecessary hospitalizations and
15	<pre>vaso-occlusive crises;</pre>
16	(3) avoid duplication of services; and
17	(4) reduce costs associated with sickle cell disease
18	<pre>treatment.</pre>
19	(d) A health home established under this section must:
20	(1) provide to a recipient diagnosed with sickle cell
21	disease:
22	(A) comprehensive care management;
23	(B) care coordination;
24	(C) health promotion;
25	(D) comprehensive transitional and follow-up
26	<pre>care;</pre>
27	(E) patient and family support; and

- 1 (F) referral to community and social support
- 2 services; and
- 3 (2) use the existing Medicaid managed care delivery
- 4 system in a manner that avoids duplication of services and payment.
- 5 SECTION 2. Sections 52.0003 and 52.0007, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 52.0003. COMPOSITION OF TASK FORCE. The task force is
- 8 composed of the following members appointed by the executive
- 9 commissioner:
- 10 (1) two members from community-based organizations
- 11 with experience addressing the needs of individuals with sickle
- 12 cell disease;
- 13 (2) two physicians specializing in hematology;
- 14 (3) two members of the public, each of whom either has
- 15 sickle cell disease or is a parent of a person with sickle cell
- 16 disease or trait; [and]
- 17 (4) one representative of a health-related
- 18 institution;
- 19 (5) one representative of the Texas Education Agency;
- 20 and
- 21 (6) one representative of the commission.
- Sec. 52.0007. ANNUAL REPORT. (a) Not later than December 1
- 23 of each year, the task force shall prepare and submit to the
- 24 governor and the legislature an annual written report that
- 25 summarizes the task force's work and includes any recommended
- 26 actions or policy changes endorsed by the task force.
- 27 (b) The task force shall, in collaboration with the

- 1 commission, include in the task force's annual report
- 2 recommendations for improving sickle cell disease education for
- 3 health care providers.
- 4 SECTION 3. Subtitle B, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Chapter 52A to read as follows:
- 6 CHAPTER 52A. SICKLE CELL DISEASE CARE EDUCATION AND TREATMENT
- 7 Sec. 52A.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "sickle cell
- 8 task force" means the sickle cell task force established under
- 9 Chapter 52.
- Sec. 52A.002. SICKLE CELL DISEASE SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM. (a)
- 11 Using grant money awarded by the Centers for Disease Control and
- 12 Prevention's Sickle Cell Data Collection Program, the department
- 13 shall establish and maintain a voluntary sickle cell disease
- 14 surveillance system to determine:
- 15 (1) the number of individuals with sickle cell disease
- 16 in this state;
- 17 (2) the manner in which individuals with sickle cell
- 18 disease use health care services; and
- 19 <u>(3) health</u> outcomes of individuals with sickle cell
- 20 disease.
- 21 (b) The sickle cell disease surveillance system must
- 22 <u>include:</u>
- 23 (1) a de-identified record of individuals diagnosed
- 24 with sickle cell disease or sickle cell trait in this state; and
- 25 (2) any other de-identified information concerning
- 26 cases of sickle cell disease or sickle cell trait that the
- 27 department considers necessary and appropriate.

(c) An individual who is diagnosed with sickle cell disease 1 2 or sickle cell trait may voluntarily register with the department for inclusion in the sickle cell disease surveillance system. 3 4 (d) After an individual registers with the department under 5 Subsection (c), a health care facility or health care provider who treats the individual shall provide to the department, in the form 6 7 and manner the department prescribes, data the department considers 8 necessary and appropriate concerning cases of sickle cell disease. 9 (e) The executive commissioner by rule shall develop 10 guidelines to: (1) obtain information from health care facilities 11 12 regarding cases of sickle cell disease; (2) protect the confidentiality of individuals 13 diagnosed with sickle cell disease in accordance with Section 14 15 159.002, Occupations Code; and 16 (3) ensure the sickle cell disease surveillance system 17 is developed in a manner consistent with: (A) the Health Insurance Portability and 18 19 Accountability Act of 1996 (Pub. L. No. 104-191); 20 (B) regulations adopted under that Act; and 21 (C) other applicable laws and regulations governing disclosure of health information. 22 23 (f) Information obtained under this section is confidential 24 and privileged and: 25 (1) is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552,

(2) is not subject to subpoena or discovery or

- 1 otherwise compelled to be produced in any administrative, civil,
- 2 criminal, or other proceeding; and
- 3 (3) may not be introduced into evidence in any
- 4 administrative, civil, criminal, or other proceeding.
- 5 (g) The department may compile and publish statistical and
- 6 other studies derived from de-identified data obtained under this
- 7 <u>chapter.</u>
- 8 (h) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
- 9 to implement this section.
- 10 Sec. 52A.003. TEXAS HEALTH SERVICE AUTHORITY EMERGENCY
- 11 DEPARTMENT ENCOUNTER NOTIFICATIONS SYSTEM. The Texas Health
- 12 Services Authority established under Chapter 182 shall collect and
- 13 analyze clinical data and use the emergency department encounter
- 14 notifications system to ensure an individual diagnosed with sickle
- 15 <u>cell disease is not incorrectly identified as an individual who</u>
- 16 misuses opioid drugs.
- 17 Sec. 52A.004. EMERGENCY AND PRIMARY CARE MEDICINE GRADUATE
- 18 MEDICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM CURRICULUM. (a) In this section,
- 19 "graduate medical education program" and "medical school" have the
- 20 meanings assigned by Section 58A.001, Education Code.
- 21 (b) A medical school in this state that offers an emergency
- 22 <u>medicine</u>, family medicine, or internal medicine residency program
- 23 shall include in the curriculum requirements for the program
- 24 education focused on sickle cell disease and sickle cell trait. The
- 25 medical school may enter into agreements as necessary for the
- 26 purposes of this section.
- Sec. 52A.005. INFORMATION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT

- 1 PERSONNEL. (a) The Texas Education Agency shall partner with
- 2 sickle cell disease community-based organizations to provide
- 3 information on sickle cell disease and sickle cell trait to public
- 4 school districts and district staff, including school nurses,
- 5 teachers, and coaches.
- 6 (b) The commission in collaboration with the sickle cell
- 7 <u>task force shall explore methods for improving sickle cell disease</u>
- 8 education and awareness within the public school system and provide
- 9 recommendations to the Texas Education Agency on the improvement
- 10 methods.
- 11 SECTION 4. (a) Not later than the second anniversary of the
- 12 date the Health and Human Services Commission establishes a health
- 13 home for Medicaid recipients diagnosed with sickle cell disease in
- 14 accordance with Section 533.0091(c), Government Code, as added by
- 15 this Act, the commission shall submit to the governor and the
- 16 legislature a report on the effects of using a health home for those
- 17 recipients, including:
- 18 (1) health outcomes of those recipients; and
- 19 (2) cost savings to this state associated with sickle
- 20 cell disease treatment.
- 21 (b) The Health and Human Services Commission may include the
- 22 report required under Subsection (a) of this section with the
- 23 annual report the sickle cell task force is required to submit under
- 24 Section 52.0007, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 5. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 26 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 27 Services Commission shall:

- 1 (1) in accordance with Section 1945, Social Security
- 2 Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1396w-4), seek from the appropriate federal
- 3 agency an amendment to the state's Medicaid state plan to implement
- 4 Section 533.0091, Government Code, as added by this Act, and the
- 5 commission may delay implementing that section until the state plan
- 6 amendment is approved;
- 7 (2) appoint the new members of the sickle cell task
- 8 force as required by Section 52.0003, Health and Safety Code, as
- 9 amended by this Act; and
- 10 (3) apply for a grant from the Centers for Disease
- 11 Control and Prevention's Sickle Cell Data Collection Program to
- 12 establish a voluntary sickle cell disease surveillance system under
- 13 Section 52A.002, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 14 SECTION 6. Section 52A.004, Health and Safety Code, as
- 15 added by this Act, applies to residents entering an emergency
- 16 medicine, family medicine, or internal residency program at a
- 17 medical school in this state on or after January 1, 2024.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
