H.B. No. 1550

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the continuation and functions of the Office of 3 State-Federal Relations. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 751.003, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 751.003. SUNSET PROVISION. The Office 7 of State-Federal Relations is subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset 8 9 Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the office is abolished [and this chapter expires] September 1, 10 11 2035 [2023]. 12 SECTION 2. Section 751.005, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (f) to read as 13 14 follows: The office shall: (b) 15 help coordinate state and federal programs dealing 16 (1) with the same subject; 17 inform the governor and the legislature of federal 18 (2) programs that may be carried out in the state or that affect state 19 20 programs; 21 (3) provide federal agencies and the United States 22 Congress with information about state policy and state conditions 23 on matters that concern the federal government; 24 (4) provide the legislature with information useful in

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measuring the effect of federal actions on the state and local 1 programs; 2 3 (5) prepare and supply to the governor and all members of the legislature an annual report that: 4 5 (A) describes the office's operations; 6 (B) contains the office's priorities and 7 strategies for the following year; 8 (C) details projects and legislation pursued by the office; and 9 discusses (D) 10 issues in the following congressional session of interest to this state; [and 11 [(E) contains an analysis of federal funds 12 availability and formulae; 13 notify the governor, the lieutenant governor, the 14 (6) 15 speaker of the house of representatives, and the legislative standing committees in each house with primary jurisdiction over 16 17 intergovernmental affairs of federal activities relevant to the state and inform the Texas congressional delegation of state 18 activities; 19 (7) conduct frequent conference calls 20 with the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of representatives 21 or their designees regarding state-federal relations and programs; 22 23 (8) respond to requests for information from the 24 legislature, the United States Congress, and federal agencies; 25 (9) coordinate with the Legislative Budget Board 26 regarding the effects of federal funding on the state budget; and 27 (10) report to, and on request send appropriate

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representatives to appear before, the legislative standing 1 2 committees in each house with primary jurisdiction over 3 intergovernmental affairs. 4 (f) The office shall post the report required under 5 Subsection (b)(5) to the office's publicly accessible Internet 6 website. 7 SECTION 3. The following provisions of the Government Code are repealed: 8 9 (1) the heading to Subchapter A, Chapter 751; and 10 (2) Subchapter B, Chapter 751. 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
