Section 402.010, Government Code, is amended by adding Subsections (c-1) and (c-2) to read as follows: 6 7 (c-1) The attorney general may not settle or compromise any claim in an action against this state or a state agency if the 8 9 settlement or compromise has the effect of holding that a state 10 statute is unconstitutional. 11 (c-2) If a state agency in the executive or legislative 12 branch of state government is a defendant in an action in which a party to the litigation files a petition, motion, or other pleading 13 14 challenging the constitutionality of a state statute and the attorney general elects not to defend the agency, the attorney 15 16 general shall pay or reimburse the reasonable expenses incurred by the agency in defending the action, including court costs, 17 investigative costs, deposition expenses, witness fees, and 18 attorney's fees. This subsection does not apply to representation 19 of the agency before the supreme court in violation of Section 22, 20 Article IV, Texas Constitution. 21 SECTION 2.
