A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to strategies to increase the availability of child-care and prekindergarten programs.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 302, Labor Code, is amended by adding Sections 302.0051 and 302.0063 to read as follows:

Sec. 302.0051. PREKINDERGARTEN PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall establish and administer a prekindergarten partnership program to assist child-care providers who meet the definition of an eligible private provider under Section 29.171, Education Code, in partnering with local school districts and

open-enrollment charter schools to provide the prekindergarten classes required under Section 29.153, Education Code.

(b) Using existing funds, the commission shall coordinate with the Texas Education Agency to develop joint strategies to expand the availability of prekindergarten partnership programs.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "program" means the professional development scholarship program established under this section.

(b) From funds appropriated for the purpose, the commission establish and administer a professional development rship program for current and prospective child-care scholarship workers.

A scholarship under the program may be used to pay an (c) individual's costs related to:
