- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 447.003, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 447.003. LIAISON TO FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. The state
- 8 energy conservation office is the state liaison to the federal
- 9 government for the implementation and administration of federal
- 10 programs relating to state agency energy matters. The office shall
- 11 administer state programs established under:
- 12 (1) Part D, Title III, Energy Policy and Conservation
- 13 Act (42 U.S.C. Section 6321 et seq.), and its subsequent
- 14 amendments;
- 15 (2) Part G, Title III, Energy Policy and Conservation
- 16 Act (42 U.S.C. Section 6371 et seq.), and its subsequent
- 17 amendments; [and]
- 18 (3) the Clean School Bus Program and other energy
- 19 conservation, resilience, and reliability programs established by
- 20 the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Public Law 117-58), and
- 21 its subsequent amendments; and
- $\underline{(4)}$  other federal energy conservation programs as
- 23 assigned to the office by the governor or the legislature.
- SECTION 2. Section 2305.031, Government Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 2305.031. OIL OVERCHARGE PROGRAMS. (a) The energy
- 3 office shall maintain a revolving loan program for the benefit of:
- 4 <u>(1)</u> state agencies, universities, and political
- 5 subdivisions; and
- 6 (2) open-enrollment charter schools for the purposes
- 7 of Section 2305.040.
- 8 <u>(b)</u> The energy office shall use oil overcharge funds for the
- 9 programs and purposes in this subchapter.
- 10 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 2305, Government Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 2305.040 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 2305.040. ENERGY EFFICIENT SCHOOLS PROGRAM. (a) In
- 13 this section, "bus" has the meaning assigned by Section 34.015(a),
- 14 Education Code.
- 15 (b) The energy efficient schools program is a program to
- 16 promote, facilitate, and support the use of electric buses and
- 17 solar panels in public schools and open-enrollment charter schools
- 18 through grants, partnerships, and loans.
- (c) The energy office is the supervising agency for the
- 20 energy efficient schools program.
- 21 <u>(d) A project funded under the energy efficient schools</u>
- 22 program may include:
- 23 (1) the acquisition of electric buses and charging
- 24 stations by school districts and open-enrollment charter schools;
- 25 (2) the acquisition of solar panels for school
- 26 campuses by school districts and open-enrollment charter schools;
- 27 and

- (3) electricity storage projects to provide efficient 1 2 means of making stored energy available during periods of peak energy use, including: 3 (A) projects to store electricity in buses; and 4
- 5 (B) projects to store electricity produced from
- 6 solar generation.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
