## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a limitation on the amount of school property tax
3	revenue that is subject to recapture under the public school
4	finance system.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 49, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 49.1531 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 49.1531. LIMITATION ON TOTAL COST. (a)
9	Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, a school
10	district that executes an agreement to purchase attendance credit
11	in an amount sufficient to reduce the district's local revenue
12	level to a level that is equal to or less than the level established
13	under Section 48.257:
14	(1) is entitled to retain maintenance and operations
15	tax revenue sufficient to pay the district's average maintenance
16	and operations costs per student in average daily attendance, as
17	determined under Subsection (b) and adjusted for inflation; and
18	(2) may not be required to pay a total amount for
19	attendance credit that would reduce the district's retained
20	maintenance and operations tax revenue below the amount described
21	by Subdivision (1).
22	(b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(1), the commissioner
23	shall determine a school district's average maintenance and
24	operations costs per student in average daily attendance based on

- 1 the district's maintenance and operations expenditures per student
- 2 in average daily attendance for the preceding three school years.
- 3 The commissioner shall <u>adjust a district's average costs to reflect</u>
- 4 inflation in a manner determined appropriate by the commissioner.
- 5 (c) A determination by the commissioner under this section
- 6 is final and may not be appealed.
- 7 (d) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
- 8 implement this section.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
