5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
7	by adding Subchapter Y to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER Y. APPLICABILITY OF LAWS PROHIBITING HEALTH CARE
9	SERVICES
10	Sec. 161.751. APPLICABILITY OF LAWS ON PROVISION OF MONEY
11	TO CERTAIN ORGANIZATIONS. The provision of money, including a
12	donation or gift, to an organization that provides support services
13	to an individual in accessing a health care service:
14	(1) does not constitute a violation of any prohibition
15	under state law on the provision of that health care service; and
16	(2) may not be the basis for a cause of action related
17	to the provision of that health care service.
18	SECTION 2. Section 19.06, Penal Code, is amended to read as
19	follows:
20	Sec. 19.06. APPLICABILITY TO CERTAIN CONDUCT. This chapter
21	does not apply to the death of an unborn child if the conduct

- 20 (2) a lawful medical procedure performed by a

- 22 (3) a lawful medical procedure performed by a
- 23 physician or other licensed health care provider with the requisite
- 24 consent as part of an assisted reproduction as defined by Section
- 25 160.102, Family Code; [<del>or</del>]
- 26 (4) the dispensation of a drug in accordance with law
- 27 or administration of a drug prescribed in accordance with law; or

- 4 SECTION 4. Section 171.206(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) This subchapter may not be construed to:
- 7 (1) authorize the initiation of a cause of action
- 8 against or the prosecution of a woman on whom an abortion is
- 9 performed or induced or attempted to be performed or induced in
- 10 violation of this subchapter;
- 11 (2) wholly or partly repeal, either expressly or by
- 12 implication, any other statute that regulates or prohibits
- 13 abortion[, including Chapter 6-1/2, Title 71, Revised Statutes]; or
- 14 (3) restrict a political subdivision from regulating
- 15 or prohibiting abortion in a manner that is at least as stringent as
- 16 the laws of this state.
- SECTION 5. Section 171.207(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (b) Subsection (a) may not be construed to:
- 20 (1) legalize the conduct prohibited by this subchapter
- 21 [or by Chapter 6-1/2, Title 71, Revised Statutes];
- 22 (2) limit in any way or affect the availability of a
- 23 remedy established by Section 171.208; or
- 24 (3) limit the enforceability of any other laws that
- 25 regulate or prohibit abortion.
- SECTION 6. Chapter 6-1/2, Title 71, Revised Statutes, is
- 27 repealed.
