- 10 SAFETY TRAINING. (a) In this section:
- 11 (1) "Accredited private school" means a private school
- 12 accredited by an organization recognized by the Texas Private
- 13 <u>School Accreditation Commission or the agency.</u>
- 14 (2) "Child-care facility" has the meaning assigned by
- 15 Section 42.002, Human Resources Code.
- 16 (3) "Organization providing out-of-school-time care"
- 17 includes a faith-based organization, a before-school or
- 18 <u>after-school program, a summer camp, a Texas 4-H or other</u>

- 20 (b) From money available for the purpose, a school district
- 21 may make available at no cost school safety training courses,

- 1 employees of accredited private schools located in the district or
- 2 child-care facilities or other organizations providing

- 4 who reside in the district.
- 5 (c) The agency may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
- 6 donations from any public or private source to pay the cost of
- 7 offering a school safety training course under this section.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
