## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to a school psychologist licensed under the Occupations

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 38.303(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) The task force is composed of:
8	(1) the commissioner or the commissioner's designee;
9	(2) the following additional members appointed by the
10	commissioner:
11	(A) three parents of students who are enrolled in
12	school districts or open-enrollment charter schools and receive the
13	mental health services described by Section 38.302(1);
14	(B) one person who provides the mental health
15	services described by Section 38.302(1) or the training described
16	by Section 38.302(2) and who is:
17	(i) a licensed professional counselor, as
18	defined by Section 503.002, Occupations Code;
19	(ii) a licensed clinical social worker, as
20	defined by Section 505.002, Occupations Code; or
21	(iii) a school counselor certified under
22	Subchapter B, Chapter 21;
23	(C) one person who is a psychiatrist;
24	(D) two persons who are administrators of

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- 1 districts or schools that provide the mental health services
- 2 described by Section 38.302(1) or the training described by Section
- 3 38.302(2);
- 4 (E) one person who is a member of a foundation
- 5 that invests in the mental health services described by Section
- 6 38.302(1) or the training described by Section 38.302(2);
- 7 (F) one person who is an employee of an
- 8 institution of higher education designated under Section 38.307;
- 9 and
- 10 (G) one person who is a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>]
- 11 school psychologist [psychology], as defined by Section 501.002,
- 12 Occupations Code; and
- 13 (3) for any other entity the task force considers
- 14 necessary, one person appointed by the task force for each such
- 15 entity.
- SECTION 2. Section 531.02171(a), Government Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) In this section, "health professional" means an
- 19 individual who is:
- 20 (1) licensed, registered, certified, or otherwise
- 21 authorized by this state to practice as a social worker,
- 22 occupational therapist, or speech-language pathologist;
- 23 (2) a licensed professional counselor;
- 24 (3) a licensed marriage and family therapist; or
- 25 (4) a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>] school psychologist, as
- 26 defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code [psychology].
- 27 SECTION 3. Section 501.002(2), Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (2) "School psychologist" ["Licensed specialist in
- 3 school psychology"] means a person who holds a license to engage in
- 4 the practice of psychology under Section 501.260.
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 501.051(a-1), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a-1) One of the members appointed under Subsection (a)(1)
- 8 or (a)(2) must practice as a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>] school
- 9 psychologist [psychology] under Section 501.260.
- SECTION 5. The heading to Section 501.260, Occupations
- 11 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 501.260. [LICENSED SPECIALIST IN] SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST
- 13 [PSYCHOLOGY].
- SECTION 6. Sections 501.260(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 15 are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) The executive council by rule shall issue a license to a
- 17 [licensed specialist in] school psychologist [psychology]. A
- 18 license issued under this section constitutes the appropriate
- 19 credential for a person who provides psychological services as
- 20 required by Section 21.003(b), Education Code.
- 21 (c) The rules of practice for a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>]
- 22 school <u>psychologist</u> [<del>psychology</del>] must comply with nationally
- 23 recognized standards for the practice of school psychology.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
