5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 531.02483 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 531.02483. HOME-DELIVERED MEALS PROGRAM REIMBURSEMENT
8	RATE; ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT. (a) In this section, "home-delivered

- 9 meals program" means the program administered by the commission
- 10 under which a contracted provider agency delivers meals to certain
- 11 eligible individuals, including:
- 12 (1) recipients receiving services under the STAR+PLUS
- 13 home and community-based services (HCBS) waiver program;
- 14 (2) individuals receiving community services and
- 15 supports under Title XX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
- 16 Section 1397 et seq.); and
- 17 (3) individuals receiving services from area agencies
- 18 on aging under Title III of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
- 19 Section 501 et seq.).
- 20 (b) Subject to Subsection (c), the executive commissioner
- 21 by rule shall increase the reimbursement rate ceiling prescribed
- 22 for a meal provided under the home-delivered meals program to \$10
- 23 per meal.
- (c) Not later than October 1 of each year, the reimbursement

- 1 rate ceiling for a meal provided under the home-delivered meals
- 2 program must be adjusted to reflect the change in the Consumer Price
- 3 Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) published by the Bureau of
- 4 Labor Statistics or its successor index during the preceding fiscal
- 5 <u>year.</u>
- 6 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 7 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 8 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 9 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 10 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 11 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
