A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the licensing and regulation of lactation consultants
3	and the creation of the Lactation Consultant Advisory Board;
4	requiring an occupational license; imposing fees; providing
5	penalties; creating a criminal offense.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Section 51.2031(a), Occupations Code, is amended
8	to read as follows:
9	(a) This section applies only to the regulation of the
10	following professions by the department:
11	(1) athletic trainers;
12	(2) behavior analysts;
13	(3) dietitians;
14	(4) hearing instrument fitters and dispensers;
15	(5) midwives;
16	(6) orthotists and prosthetists; [and]
17	(7) speech-language pathologists and audiologists:
18	<u>and</u>
19	(8) lactation consultants.
20	SECTION 2. Subtitle M, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
21	amended by adding Chapter 703 to read as follows:
22	CHAPTER 703. LACTATION CONSULTANTS
23	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
24	Sec. 703.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as the

- 1 Texas Lactation Consultant Practice Act.
- 2 Sec. 703.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 3 (1) "Advisory board" means the Lactation Consultant
- 4 Advisory Board.
- 5 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission of
- 6 Licensing and Regulation.
- 7 (3) "Department" means the Texas Department of
- 8 Licensing and Regulation.
- 9 (4) "Executive director" means the executive director
- 10 of the department.
- 11 (5) "International Board of Lactation Consultant
- 12 Examiners" means the international certification body that confers
- 13 the International Board Certified Lactation Consultant credential
- 14 and is independently accredited by the National Commission of
- 15 Certifying Agencies.
- 16 (6) "Lactation consultant" means a health care
- 17 professional licensed under this chapter who performs services
- 18 related to the clinical management of breastfeeding and lactation
- 19 in a variety of settings for compensation.
- Sec. 703.003. APPLICABILITY. Unless the person uses the
- 21 <u>title "lactation consultant" or "licensed lactation consultant" to</u>
- 22 describe the person's activities, this chapter does not apply to:
- 23 (1) a person licensed in this state as a physician or
- 24 <u>nurse;</u>
- 25 (2) a health care professional licensed by this state
- 26 and operating within the scope of the person's license;
- 27 (3) a person acting as a paid or volunteer peer

- 1 counselor, La Leche League Leader, doula, childbirth educator,
- 2 breastfeeding and lactation educator or counselor, or community
- 3 health worker providing educational services; or
- 4 (4) a licensed midwife.
- 5 Sec. 703.004. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Lactation
- 6 Consultant Advisory Board is subject to Chapter 325, Government
- 7 Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided
- 8 by that chapter, the Lactation Consultant Advisory Board is
- 9 abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2035.
- 10 SUBCHAPTER B. LACTATION CONSULTANT ADVISORY BOARD
- Sec. 703.051. ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERSHIP. (a) The advisory
- 12 board consists of nine members appointed by the presiding officer
- 13 of the commission with the approval of the commission as follows:
- 14 (1) five lactation consultant members, each of whom
- 15 has at least three years' experience in the practice of lactation
- 16 consulting;
- 17 (2) one physician member who is certified by a
- 18 national professional organization of physicians that certifies:
- 19 (A) obstetricians and gynecologists;
- 20 (B) family practitioners; or
- 21 <u>(C) pediatricians;</u>
- 22 (3) one member who is an advanced practice registered
- 23 nurse practicing in obstetrics, pediatrics, or family practice; and
- 24 (4) two members who represent the public and are not
- 25 practicing or trained in a health care profession, at least one of
- 26 whom is a parent who has been assisted by a lactation consultant.
- (b) Appointments to the advisory board shall be made without

- 1 regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or
- 2 national origin of the appointee.
- 3 Sec. 703.052. DUTIES OF ADVISORY BOARD. The advisory board
- 4 shall provide advice and recommendations to the department on
- 5 technical matters relevant to the administration of this chapter.
- 6 Sec. 703.053. TERMS; VACANCIES. (a) Members of the
- 7 advisory board serve staggered six-year terms. The terms of three
- 8 members expire on January 31 of each odd-numbered year.
- 9 (b) If a vacancy occurs during a member's term, the
- 10 presiding officer of the commission, with the commission's
- 11 approval, shall appoint a replacement who meets the qualifications
- 12 for the vacant position to serve for the remainder of the term.
- 13 Sec. 703.054. PRESIDING OFFICER. The presiding officer of
- 14 the commission shall designate a public member of the advisory
- 15 board to serve as the presiding officer of the advisory board for a
- 16 <u>one-year term.</u> The presiding officer of the advisory board may vote
- 17 on any matter before the advisory board.
- Sec. 703.055. MEETINGS. The advisory board shall meet at
- 19 the call of the presiding officer of the commission or the executive
- 20 director.
- 21 Sec. 703.056. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110,
- 22 Government Code, does not apply to the composition or duration of
- 23 the advisory board or to the appointment of the advisory board's
- 24 presiding officer.
- 25 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES
- Sec. 703.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The executive
- 27 director shall administer and enforce this chapter.

Τ	(b) The commission shall adopt rules:
2	(1) prescribing the standards for the practice of
3	lactation consulting in this state;
4	(2) prescribing the type of courses and number of
5	hours required to meet the basic lactation consulting education
6	course and continuing lactation consulting education course
7	requirements;
8	(3) prescribing minimum standards for the approval and
9	revocation of approval of:
10	(A) basic lactation consulting education courses
11	and continuing lactation consulting education courses; and
12	(B) instructors or facilities offering basic
13	lactation consulting education courses and continuing lactation
14	consulting education courses;
15	(4) requiring lactation consultants to obtain each
16	patient's signature on a release advising the patient that
17	lactation consultation is not a substitute for conventional medical
18	care by a physician, including diagnosis, treatment, and well-child
19	<pre>care; and</pre>
20	(5) establishing requirements necessary to establish
21	eligibility for reciprocity for initial licensing under this
22	chapter.
23	(c) The standards prescribed under Subsection (b)(1) must
24	include ethical requirements and be equivalent to national
25	standards prescribed by the International Board of Lactation
26	Consultant Examiners.

(d) The department shall:

27

1	(1) implement rules governing:
2	(A) basic lactation consulting education courses
3	and continuing lactation consulting education courses; and
4	(B) approval of instructors or facilities
5	offering basic lactation consulting education courses and
6	continuing lactation consulting education courses;
7	(2) adopt and provide information about basic
8	lactation consulting resources and instructor manuals;
9	(3) enter into agreements necessary to administer this
10	chapter; and
11	(4) establish a program to license lactation
12	consultants as prescribed by commission rules.
13	Sec. 703.102. REPORTS ON LACTATION CONSULTING. (a) The
14	department shall prepare and publish reports on the practice of
15	lactation consulting in this state.
16	(b) The Department of State Health Services shall publish a
17	statistical report of breastfeeding initiation and continuation
18	rates.
19	Sec. 703.103. COMPLAINTS. (a) For purposes of Section
20	51.252, the commission shall adopt rules to provide for the release
21	of any relevant lactation consulting or medical record to the
22	department, without the consent of the lactation consultant's
23	patient, as necessary to conduct an investigation of a complaint.
24	(b) The department shall provide reasonable assistance to a
25	person who wishes to file a complaint with the department regarding
26	a person or activity regulated by this chapter.
27	Sec 703 104 POSTER (a) The department shall maintain a

- 1 roster of each person licensed as a lactation consultant in this
- 2 state.
- 3 (b) The roster must contain for each person the information
- 4 required on the license form under this chapter and other
- 5 information the department determines necessary to accurately
- 6 identify each licensed lactation consultant. The information is
- 7 public information for purposes of Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 8 SUBCHAPTER D. LICENSE REQUIREMENTS
- 9 Sec. 703.151. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) Unless the person
- 10 holds a license issued under this chapter, a person may not use:
- 11 (1) the title "lactation consultant" or "registered
- 12 lactation consultant";
- 13 (2) the letters "LC" or "RLC"; or
- 14 (3) any other words, letters, abbreviations, or
- 15 insignia indicating or implying that the person is licensed under
- 16 this chapter.
- 17 (b) The department shall issue a license to each person who
- 18 fulfills the licensing requirements.
- 19 Sec. 703.152. QUALIFICATIONS FOR INITIAL LICENSE. A person
- 20 is qualified to become a licensed lactation consultant under this
- 21 chapter if the person provides the department with documentary
- 22 <u>evidence that the person:</u>
- 23 (1) has satisfied each requirement for basic lactation
- 24 consulting education, including clinical and hands-on training;
- 25 (2) is credentialed as a lactation consultant by the
- 26 International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners; and
- 27 (3) has passed the comprehensive lactation consulting

- 1 examination and jurisprudence examination required by this
- 2 chapter.
- 3 Sec. 703.153. LICENSE APPLICATION. A person may apply to
- 4 the department for a lactation consultant license in the manner and
- 5 on a form prescribed by the executive director. The application
- 6 must:
- 7 (1) be accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee;
- 8 and
- 9 (2) include the information required by commission
- 10 rules.
- Sec. 703.154. INITIAL LICENSE TERM. An initial lactation
- 12 consultant license is valid for one year.
- Sec. 703.155. EXAMINATION. (a) The department shall:
- 14 (1) adopt standards for a comprehensive lactation
- 15 consulting examination that an applicant must pass before an
- 16 <u>initial license may be issued; and</u>
- 17 (2) establish eligibility requirements for persons
- 18 taking a comprehensive lactation consulting examination.
- 19 (b) The department shall recognize, prepare, administer, or
- 20 arrange for the administration of an examination under this
- 21 chapter, which may include accepting the results of a
- 22 criterion-referenced, standardized national examination by the
- 23 International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners.
- Sec. 703.156. JURISPRUDENCE EXAMINATION. (a) The
- 25 department shall develop a jurisprudence examination to determine
- 26 an applicant's knowledge of this chapter, commission rules under
- 27 this chapter, and any other applicable laws of this state affecting

- 1 the applicant's lactation consulting practice. The department
- 2 shall administer the examination at least twice each calendar year.
- 3 (b) The commission shall adopt rules to implement this
- 4 section, including rules related to the development and
- 5 administration of the examination, examination fees, guidelines
- 6 for reexamination, grading the examination, and providing notice of
- 7 <u>examination results.</u>
- 8 <u>SUBCHAPTER E. LICENSE RENEWAL</u>
- 9 Sec. 703.201. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE RENEWAL. An
- 10 applicant for renewal of a license under this chapter shall apply in
- 11 the manner provided by Section 703.153.
- 12 Sec. 703.202. RENEWAL LICENSE TERM. A renewal license is
- 13 valid for two years.
- 14 Sec. 703.203. REQUIRED ATTENDANCE AT SPECIFIC LACTATION
- 15 CONSULTING EDUCATION COURSES. The department may assess the
- 16 continuing education needs of lactation consultants and in
- 17 accordance with commission rules may require lactation consultants
- 18 to attend continuing lactation consulting education courses
- 19 specified by the department.
- Sec. 703.204. EVIDENCE OF CERTAIN CREDENTIALS. An
- 21 applicant for the renewal of a license under this chapter must
- 22 provide evidence that the applicant is credentialed as a lactation
- 23 consultant by the International Board of Lactation Consultant
- 24 Examiners.
- Sec. 703.205. REFUSING RENEWAL FOR FAILURE TO PAY
- 26 ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. The department may refuse to renew the
- 27 license of a person who fails to pay an administrative penalty

- 1 unless enforcement of the penalty is stayed or a court has ordered
- 2 that the administrative penalty is not owed.
- 3 SUBCHAPTER F. DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS
- 4 Sec. 703.251. GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. (a) The
- 5 commission or executive director may take disciplinary action
- 6 against or refuse to issue or renew a license of an applicant or
- 7 license holder who:
- 8 (1) violates this chapter or a rule adopted under this
- 9 chapter;
- 10 (2) submits false or misleading information to the
- 11 department;
- 12 (3) is convicted of a misdemeanor involving moral
- 13 turpitude or a felony;
- 14 (4) uses alcohol or drugs intemperately;
- 15 (5) engages in unprofessional or dishonorable conduct
- 16 that may reasonably be determined to deceive or defraud the public;
- 17 (6) is unable to practice lactation consulting with
- 18 reasonable skill and safety because of illness, disability, or
- 19 psychological impairment;
- 20 (7) is determined by a court judgment to be mentally
- 21 impaired; or
- 22 (8) fails to practice lactation consulting in a manner
- 23 consistent with the public health and safety.
- 24 (b) The commission or executive director may take
- 25 disciplinary action against or refuse to issue or renew a license of
- 26 an applicant or license holder if disciplinary action is taken by
- 27 another jurisdiction that affects the applicant's or license

- 1 holder's authority to practice lactation consulting, including a
- 2 suspension, revocation, or other action.
- 3 SUBCHAPTER G. PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT PROVISIONS
- 4 Sec. 703.301. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) A person is liable to
- 5 this state for a civil penalty if the person knowingly or
- 6 intentionally practices lactation consulting in violation of this
- 7 chapter or a commission order.
- 8 (b) A civil penalty under this section may not exceed \$250
- 9 for each violation. Each day of violation constitutes a separate
- 10 violation for purposes of penalty assessment. In determining the
- 11 amount of the penalty, the court shall consider:
- 12 (1) the person's history of previous violations;
- 13 (2) the seriousness of the violation;
- 14 (3) any hazard to the health and safety of the public;
- 15 <u>and</u>
- 16 (4) the demonstrated good faith of the person charged.
- Sec. 703.302. INJUNCTIONS. (a) In this section, "health
- 18 authority" means a physician who administers state and local laws
- 19 regulating public health under Chapter 121, Health and Safety Code.
- 20 (b) If the executive director or a health authority
- 21 determines that a person has violated this chapter, the executive
- 22 director may institute an action for injunctive relief as described
- 23 <u>by Section 51.352.</u>
- Sec. 703.303. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- 25 offense if the person knowingly practices lactation consulting in
- 26 violation of this chapter.
- 27 (b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.

- 1 Sec. 703.304. CEASE AND DESIST ORDER. A violation of a
- 2 cease and desist order issued by the executive director constitutes
- 3 grounds for imposing an administrative penalty under Subchapter F,
- 4 Chapter 51.
- 5 SECTION 3. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 6 date of this Act, the presiding officer of the Texas Commission of
- 7 Licensing and Regulation shall appoint the initial members to the
- 8 Lactation Consultant Advisory Board as required by Section 703.051,
- 9 Occupations Code, as added by this Act. In appointing the members,
- 10 the presiding officer shall appoint three members to terms expiring
- 11 January 31, 2025, three members to terms expiring January 31, 2027,
- 12 and three members to terms expiring January 31, 2029.
- 13 (b) Notwithstanding Section 703.051(a)(1), Occupations
- 14 Code, as added by this Act, a person who has practiced as a
- 15 lactation consultant for the period required by that subdivision is
- 16 eligible for appointment as an initial member of the Lactation
- 17 Consultant Advisory Board regardless of whether the person holds a
- 18 lactation consultant license issued under Chapter 703, Occupations
- 19 Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 4. Not later than June 1, 2024, the Texas Commission
- 21 of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt the rules, procedures, and
- 22 fees necessary to implement Chapter 703, Occupations Code, as added
- 23 by this Act.
- SECTION 5. Subchapters F and G, Chapter 51, Occupations
- 25 Code, do not apply to conduct described by Section 703.151,
- 26 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, before September 1, 2024.
- 27 SECTION 6. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of

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- 1 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
- 2 (b) Section 703.151, Occupations Code, and Subchapters F
- 3 and G, Chapter 703, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, take
- 4 effect September 1, 2024.
