## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to eligibility requirements for student loan repayment
- 3 assistance for certain mental health professionals.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.603, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 61.603. ELIGIBILITY. (a) Except as provided by
- 8 Subsection (b), to [To] be eligible to receive repayment assistance
- 9 under this subchapter, a mental health professional must:
- 10 (1) apply to the board;
- 11 (2) have completed one, two, three, four, or five
- 12 consecutive years of practice in a mental health professional
- 13 shortage area designated by the Department of State Health
- 14 Services; and
- 15 (3) provide mental health services in this state to:
- 16 (A) recipients under the medical assistance
- 17 program authorized by Chapter 32, Human Resources Code;
- 18 (B) enrollees under the child health plan program
- 19 authorized by Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code; or
- (C) persons committed to a secure correctional
- 21 facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Juvenile
- 22 Justice Department or persons confined in a secure correctional
- 23 facility operated by or under contract with any division of the
- 24 Texas Department of Criminal Justice.

- 1 (b) A mental health professional may also establish
- 2 eligibility for the repayment assistance under this subchapter by
- 3 satisfying the requirements of this subsection. To establish
- 4 eligibility under this subsection, the mental health professional
- 5 must:
- 6 (1) apply to the board;
- 7 (2) provide mental health services to:
- 8 (A) patients in a state hospital, as defined by
- 9 Section 552.0011, Health and Safety Code; or
- 10 (B) individuals receiving community-based mental
- 11 health services from a local mental health authority that provides
- 12 the services in accordance with Subchapter B, Chapter 534, Health
- 13 and Safety Code; and
- 14 (3) have completed one, two, three, four, or five
- 15 consecutive years of practice in this state as described by
- 16 Subdivision (2).
- 17 (c) In addition to satisfying the requirements under
- 18 Subsection (a) or (b), for a licensed physician to be eligible to
- 19 receive repayment assistance under this subchapter after the
- 20 physician's third consecutive year of practice described under
- 21 Subsection (a)(2) or (b)(3), as applicable, the physician must be
- 22 certified in psychiatry by:
- 23 (1) the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology; or
- 24 (2) the American Osteopathic Board of Neurology and
- 25 Psychiatry.
- SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 27 61.603, Education Code, applies only to a person who first

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- 1 establishes eligibility for loan repayment assistance under
- 2 Subchapter K, Chapter 61, Education Code, as amended by this Act, on
- 3 the basis of an application submitted on or after September 1, 2023.
- 4 A person who first establishes eligibility on the basis of an
- 5 application submitted before September 1, 2023, is governed by the
- 6 law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the
- 7 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
