6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 37.08135 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 37.08135. SOCIAL WORKER REQUIRED. The board of
9	trustees of each school district shall employ one or more social
10	workers licensed under Chapter 505, Occupations Code, to work with
11	the district's peace officers, school resource officers, or other
12	security personnel to:
13	(1) identify and address underlying student behaviors
14	related to social, emotional, behavioral, mental, or substance
15	abuse issues;
16	(2) assist with emergency situations at the district;
17	<u>and</u>
18	(3) provide wrap-around services, case management,
19	and ongoing support to students enrolled at the district and the
20	students' families.
21	SECTION 2. Section 37.115(e), Education Code, is amended to

(e) The superintendent of a school district shall assign to

- 12 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024 13 school year.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
