1	AN ACT
2	relating to notice of rights provided to a patient receiving
3	involuntary inpatient mental health services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 576.009, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 576.009. NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS. <u>(a)</u> A patient
8	receiving involuntary inpatient mental health services shall be
9	informed of the rights provided by this subtitle:
10	(1) <u>through a poster prominently and conspicuously</u>
11	displayed in an area frequented by both patients and employees of
12	the mental health facility; and
13	(2) either:
14	(A) orally, in simple, nontechnical terms, and in
15	writing that[, if possible,] is in the person's primary language;
16	or
17	(B) $[(2)]$ through the use of a means reasonably
18	calculated to communicate with a hearing impaired or visually
19	impaired person, if applicable.
20	(b) The poster described by Subsection (a)(1) must:
21	(1) include the name and contact information of the
22	person with whom a complaint regarding a violation of the rights
23	provided by this subtitle may be filed; and
24	(2) be in English and in a second language appropriate

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1	to the demographic composition of the community served by the
2	mental health facility.
3	(c) The oral and written communication required by
4	Subsection (a)(2)(A) must be provided on two separate days as
5	follows:
6	(1) if English is the patient's primary language:
7	(A) at the time the patient is admitted to the
8	mental health facility; and
9	(B) not later than the third day after the date
10	the patient is admitted to the mental health facility; or
11	(2) if English is not the patient's primary language:
12	(A) not later than 24 hours after the patient is
13	admitted to the mental health facility; and
14	(B) not later than the third day after the date
15	the patient is admitted to the mental health facility.
16	SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
17	a patient's admittance to an inpatient mental health facility on or
18	after the effective date of this Act. A patient's admittance to an
19	inpatient mental health facility before the effective date of this
20	Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the patient was
21	admitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
22	purpose.
23	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
