4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 54.353(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) The governing board of an institution of higher
8	education shall exempt from the payment of tuition and laboratory
9	fees any student enrolled in one or more courses offered as part of
10	a fire science curriculum who:
11	(1) is employed as a firefighter by a political
12	subdivision of this state; or
13	(2) is a member in good standing of a volunteer fire
14	department that is registered with the Texas A&M Forest Service and
15	responds to 9-1-1 emergency calls in a designated area [currently,
16	and has been for at least one year, an active member of an organized
17	volunteer fire department participating in the Texas Emergency
18	Services Retirement System or a retirement system established under
19	the Texas Local Fire Fighters Retirement Act (Article 6243e,
20	Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes) and who:

- 12 SECTION 2. Section 54.353(a), Education Code, as amended by
- 13 this Act, applies beginning with tuition and laboratory fees
- 14 charged for the 2023 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory fees
- 15 charged for an academic period before that semester are covered by
- 16 the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act,
- 17 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
