1	AN ACT
2	relating to measures to prepare students to teach bilingual
3	education, English as a second language, or Spanish.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 29.1831 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 29.1831. PROGRAM OF STUDY IN BILINGUAL EDUCATION,
8	ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE, AND SPANISH. (a) The agency shall
9	develop a program of study for use in career and technology
10	education programs that prepares and assists students in pursuing a
11	career teaching:
12	(1) bilingual education;
13	(2) English as a second language; or
14	(3) Spanish.
15	(b) The agency shall post on the agency's Internet website
16	information regarding:
17	(1) the program of study developed under this section;
18	and
19	(2) the financial incentive program to prepare
20	teachers to obtain certification to teach bilingual education,
21	English as a second language, or Spanish administered by the Texas
22	Higher Education Coordinating Board under Subchapter SS, Chapter
23	<u>61.</u>
24	SECTION 2. Section 33.007(b), Education Code, is amended to

1 read as follows:

(b) During the first school year a student is enrolled in a 2 3 high school or at the high school level in an open-enrollment charter school, and again during each year of a student's 4 5 enrollment in high school or at the high school level, a school counselor shall provide information about postsecondary education 6 7 to the student and the student's parent or guardian. The 8 information must include information regarding:

(1) the importance of postsecondary education;

10 (2) the advantages of earning an endorsement and a 11 performance acknowledgment and completing the distinguished level 12 of achievement under the foundation high school program under 13 Section 28.025;

14 (3) the disadvantages of taking courses to prepare for 15 a high school equivalency examination relative to the benefits of 16 taking courses leading to a high school diploma;

17 (4) financial aid eligibility;

18 (5) instruction on how to apply for federal financial19 aid;

20 (6) the center for financial aid information
21 established under Section 61.0776;

(7) the automatic admission of certain students to general academic teaching institutions as provided by Section 51.803;

(8) the eligibility and academic performance requirements for the TEXAS Grant as provided by Subchapter M, Chapter 56;

1 (9) the availability of programs in the district under 2 which a student may earn college credit, including advanced 3 placement programs, dual credit programs, joint high school and 4 college credit programs, and international baccalaureate programs;

5 (10) the availability of education and training 6 vouchers and tuition and fee waivers to attend an institution of 7 higher education as provided by Section 54.366 for a student who is 8 or was previously in the conservatorship of the Department of 9 Family and Protective Services; [and]

10 (11) the availability of college credit awarded by 11 institutions of higher education to veterans and military 12 servicemembers for military experience, education, and training 13 obtained during military service as described by the informational 14 materials developed under Section 302.0031(h), Labor Code; and

15 <u>(12) the availability of programs that prepare</u> 16 <u>students for teaching bilingual education, English as a second</u> 17 <u>language, or Spanish, including:</u>

18 (A) the program of study developed under Section 19 29.1831; and

(B) the financial incentive program administered
 by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Subchapter
 22 <u>SS, Chapter 61</u>.

SECTION 3. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
Subchapter SS to read as follows:

25 <u>SUBCHAPTER SS. FINANCIAL INCENTIVE PROGRAM TO PREPARE TEACHERS IN</u>

- 26 BILINGUAL EDUCATION, ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE, AND SPANISH
- 27 Sec. 61.99991. ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF

1	PROGRAM. (a) The board shall establish a program to provide
2	financial incentives such as tuition assistance or student loan
3	repayment to:
4	(1) assist persons in obtaining certification to teach
5	bilingual education, English as a second language, or Spanish in a
6	public elementary or secondary school in this state; and
7	(2) facilitate the employment of those persons by a
8	public elementary or secondary school in this state that has a
9	shortage of teachers certified to teach in those fields.
10	(b) In administering the program, the board shall give
11	priority to awarding financial incentives to those eligible persons
12	who demonstrate the greatest financial need.
13	Sec. 61.99992. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive
14	financial incentives under this subchapter, a person must:
15	(1) apply to the board in the form and manner
16	prescribed by board rule;
17	(2) be admitted into an educator preparation program
18	at an institution of higher education or at a private or independent
19	institution of higher education that prepares students for
20	certification to teach bilingual education, English as a second
21	language, or Spanish;
22	(3) enter into an agreement with the board as provided
23	by Section 61.99993; and
24	(4) satisfy any other criteria jointly prescribed by
25	the board and the State Board for Educator Certification.
26	Sec. 61.99993. AGREEMENT. To qualify for financial
27	incentives under this subchapter, a person must enter into a

1	written agreement with the board as provided by this section. The
2	agreement must require the person to:
3	(1) obtain, within the period prescribed by board
4	rule, certification to teach bilingual education, English as a
5	second language, or Spanish in a public elementary or secondary
6	<pre>school in this state;</pre>
7	(2) accept, during the first school year that begins
8	after the date the person becomes certified as provided by
9	Subdivision (1), an offer of full-time employment to teach
10	bilingual education, English as a second language, or Spanish in a
11	public elementary or secondary school in this state that has a
12	shortage of teachers certified to teach in one or more of those
13	fields; and
14	(3) teach bilingual education, English as a second
15	language, or Spanish at that school for at least two school years.
16	Sec. 61.99994. FINANCIAL INCENTIVES. The board shall award
17	financial incentives such as tuition assistance or student loan
18	repayment to each participant in the program to assist with the cost
19	of payment of mandatory tuition and fees for courses required to
20	obtain certification to teach bilingual education, English as a
21	second language, or Spanish.
22	Sec. 61.99995. REIMBURSEMENT; EXCEPTIONS. (a) A program
23	participant who fails to meet the requirements of Section 61.99993
24	shall reimburse the board for the amount of any assistance received
25	by the participant under this subchapter.
26	(b) The board by rule shall establish exceptions to the

27 reimbursement requirement under this section for participants who

are unable to meet the requirements of Section 61.99993 as a result
 of an unusual hardship.

3 <u>Sec. 61.99996.</u> GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. In addition 4 <u>to money appropriated by the legislature, the board may solicit and</u> 5 <u>accept gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of this</u> 6 <u>subchapter.</u>

Sec. 61.99997. RULES. The board shall adopt rules
necessary for the administration of this subchapter, including a
rule that sets the maximum amount of financial assistance that a
person may receive under this subchapter in one year.

SECTION 4. The Texas Education Agency shall develop the program of study for use in a school district's career and technology education program to teach bilingual education, English as a second language, or Spanish as required by Section 29.1831, Education Code, as added by this Act, beginning not later than the 2024-2025 school year.

SECTION 5. Section 33.007(b), Education Code, as amended by
this Act, applies beginning with the 2024-2025 school year.

19 SECTION 6. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 20 shall adopt rules for the administration of Subchapter SS, Chapter 21 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable 22 after this Act takes effect.

23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
