- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 504.945, Transportation Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (f) to read as
- 7 follows:

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- 8 (b) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [<u>Subsection</u>] (e) <u>and</u>
- 9 (f), an offense under Subsection (a) is a misdemeanor punishable by
- 10 a fine of not more than \$200, unless it is shown at the trial of the
- 11 offense that the owner knowingly altered or made illegible the
- 12 letters, numbers, and other identification marks, in which case the
- 13 offense is a Class B misdemeanor.
- 14 (f) An offense under Subsection (a)(7)(C) is a misdemeanor
- 15 punishable by a fine of not more than \$300, except that the offense
- 16 is:
- 17 (1) a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than
- 18 \$600 if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the person has
- 19 been previously convicted of an offense under Subsection (a)(7)(C);
- 20 <u>or</u>
- 21 (2) a Class B misdemeanor if it is shown on the trial
- 22 of the offense that the person has been previously convicted two or
- 23 more times of an offense under Subsection (a)(7)(C).

- 2 (d) An inspection station or inspector may not issue a
- 3 passing vehicle inspection report for a vehicle equipped with:
- 4 (1) a sunscreening device prohibited by Section
- 5 547.613, except that the department by rule shall provide
- 6 procedures for issuance of a passing vehicle inspection report for
- 7 a vehicle exempt under Section 547.613(c); [or]
- 8 (2) a compressed natural gas container unless the
- 9 owner demonstrates in accordance with department rules proof:
- 10 (A) that:
- 11 (i) the container has met the inspection
- 12 requirements under 49 C.F.R. Section 571.304; and
- 13 (ii) the manufacturer's recommended service
- 14 life for the container, as stated on the container label required by
- 15 49 C.F.R. Section 571.304, has not expired; or
- 16 (B) that the vehicle is a fleet vehicle for which
- 17 the fleet operator employs a technician certified to inspect the
- 18 container; or
- 19 (3) a license plate prohibited by Section 504.945.
- SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 21 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 22 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 23 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 24 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 25 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 26 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 27 committed before that date.
