- 2 or another judicial agency having statewide jurisdiction.
- 3 (b) A construction contract between a governmental entity
- 4 and a contractor may not prohibit or limit the award of compensatory
- 5 damages to the contractor for a delay caused solely by the
- 6 governmental entity.
- 7 (c) This section may not be waived. A purported waiver of
- 8 this section in violation of this subsection is void.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 2252.909, Government Code, as added by
- 10 this Act, applies only to a construction contract entered into on or
- 11 after the effective date of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
