- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter K, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 1701.5015 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 1701.5015. FAILURE TO COOPERATE WITH INVESTIGATION BY
- 9 LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b),
- 10 the commission shall suspend or revoke the license of a peace
- 11 officer who fails to cooperate, including by submitting to an
- 12 interview, with a law enforcement agency during an investigation by
- 13 the agency.
- 14 (b) A peace officer's license may not be suspended or
- 15 revoked under this section solely on the grounds that the peace
- 16 officer invoked the officer's right against self-incrimination
- 17 under the United States Constitution or the Texas Constitution.
- 18 <u>(c) The commission shall adopt rules to implement this</u>
- 19 section.
- 20 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 21 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt the
- 22 rules required by Section 1701.5015, Occupations Code, as added by
- 23 this Act.
- SECTION 3. Section 1701.5015, Occupations Code, as added by

- 1 this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after the
- 2 effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 3 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 4 date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect
- 5 for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
