A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

H.B. No. 2382

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of crafted precious metal. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 1956.051(3), Occupations 4 Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 (3) "Crafted precious metal" means jewelry, 7 silverware, an art object, or another object, made wholly or partly from precious metal and used primarily for personal, family, or 8 9 household purposes [purchases]. The term does not include: (A) a coin; 10 11 (B) a bar; 12 (C) a commemorative medallion; [an item selling at 105 percent or more of the 13 (D) 14 [(E)] an item made wholly or partly from precious 15 16 metal and used for a dental, pharmaceutical, or medical 17 application; or 18 (E) (F) an item made wholly or partly from precious metal extracted, recovered, or salvaged from an industrial 19 20 by-product or industrial waste product. 21 SECTION 2. Section 1956.062(d), Occupations Code, 22 amended to read as follows: 23 (d) The dealer shall:

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(1) provide to a peace officer, on demand, the list

- 1 required by Subsection (b); and
- 2 (2) submit [mail or deliver a complete copy of] the
- 3 list to the online database designated under [chief of police or the
- 4 sheriff as provided by Section 1956.063 not later than 48 hours
- 5 after the list is filed with the dealer.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 1956.063, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsections (b-1)
- 8 and (b-2) to read as follows:
- 9 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (b-2), a dealer shall
- 10 <u>submit</u> [If a transaction regulated by this subchapter occurs in a
- 11 municipality that maintains a police department, the original and a
- 12 copy of] the report required by this subchapter [shall be
- 13 submitted] to an online database that is:
- 14 (1) used by law enforcement agencies to investigate
- offenses related to crafted precious metal and other property; and
- 16 (2) designated by the commission under Subsection
- 17 (b-1) for purposes of this section [the municipality's chief of
- 18 police. If the transaction does not occur in such a municipality,
- 19 the original and a copy of the report shall be submitted to the
- 20 sheriff of the county in which the transaction occurs].
- 21 (b-1) The commission by rule shall designate the database to
- 22 which a dealer is required to report under Subsection (b).
- 23 (b-2) If the commission determines that no appropriate
- 24 online database exists for submitting reports required by this
- 25 subchapter, the commission by rule shall establish an alternative
- 26 procedure under which dealers are required to submit those reports.
- (c) For each transaction regulated by this subchapter, the

- 1 dealer shall submit a report on a [preprinted and prenumbered] form
- 2 prescribed by the commissioner or in the manner described by
- 3 Subsection (c-1). The form must include the following:
- 4 (1) the date of the transaction;
- 5 (2) a description of the crafted precious metal
- 6 purchased by the dealer;
- 7 (3) the name and physical address of the dealer; and
- 8 (4) the name, physical description, and physical
- 9 address of the seller or transferor.
- SECTION 4. Section 1956.069(a), Occupations Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) A person commits an offense if the person:
- 13 (1) fails to make or permit inspection of a report as
- 14 required by Section 1956.062 or 1956.063;
- 15 (2) violates Section 1956.0612 or 1956.064;
- 16 (3) fails to permit inspection of crafted precious
- 17 metal as required by Section 1956.065;
- 18 (4) fails to obtain or retain a statement as required
- 19 by Section 1956.066;
- 20 (5) [(4)] fails to file a registration statement as
- 21 required by Section 1956.067; or
- (6) $[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$ purchases an object in violation of Section
- 23 1956.068.
- 24 SECTION 5. Sections 1956.062 and 1956.063, Occupations
- 25 Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to a transaction that
- 26 occurs on or after January 1, 2024.
- 27 SECTION 6. Section 1956.069(a), Occupations Code, as

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- 1 amended by this Act, applies only to an offense committed on or
- 2 after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before
- 3 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on
- 4 the date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued
- 5 in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an
- 6 offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any
- 7 element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 8 SECTION 7. Not later than December 1, 2023, the Finance
- 9 Commission of Texas by rule shall designate the online database as
- 10 required by Section 1956.063, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 11 Act.
- 12 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
