A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of crafted precious metal. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 1956.051(3), Occupations 4 Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 (3) "Crafted precious metal" means jewelry, 7 silverware, an art object, or another object, made wholly or partly from precious metal and used primarily for personal, family, or 8 9 household purposes [purchases]. The term does not include: 10 (A) a coin; 11 (B) a bar; 12 (C) a commemorative medallion; 13 [an item selling at 105 percent or more of the (D) 14 [(E)] an item made wholly or partly from precious 15 16 metal and used for a dental, pharmaceutical, or medical 17 application; or 18 (E) (F) an item made wholly or partly from precious metal extracted, recovered, or salvaged from an industrial 19 20 by-product or industrial waste product. 21 SECTION 2. Section 1956.062(a), Occupations Code, 22 amended to read as follows:

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1956.063 and 1956.0635, report all identifiable crafted precious

(a) A dealer shall, as required by Sections [Section]

- 1 metal that the dealer purchases, takes in trade, accepts for sale on
- 2 consignment, or accepts for auction.
- 3 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 1956, Occupations Code, is
- 4 amended by adding Section 1956.0635 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 1956.0635. REPORT TO ELECTRONIC DATABASE. (a) In
- 6 addition to the report required by Section 1956.063, a dealer shall
- 7 report each transaction regulated by this subchapter to an online
- 8 database that is:
- 9 (1) used by law enforcement agencies to investigate
- 10 offenses related to crafted precious metal and other property; and
- 11 (2) designated by the department for purposes of this
- 12 section.
- 13 (b) The department by rule shall designate the database to
- 14 which a dealer is required to report under Subsection (a).
- SECTION 4. Section 1956.069(a), Occupations Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) A person commits an offense if the person:
- 18 (1) fails to make or permit inspection of a report as
- 19 required by Section 1956.062, [or] 1956.063, or 1956.0635;
- 20 (2) violates Section 1956.0612 or 1956.064;
- 21 (3) fails to permit inspection of crafted precious
- 22 metal as required by Section 1956.065;
- 23 <u>(4)</u> fails to obtain or retain a statement as required
- 24 by Section 1956.066;
- 25 $\underline{(5)}$ [$\underline{(4)}$] fails to file a registration statement as
- 26 required by Section 1956.067; or
- (6) $\left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ purchases an object in violation of Section

- 1 1956.068.
- 2 SECTION 5. Section 1956.0635, Occupations Code, as added by
- 3 this Act, applies only to a transaction that occurs on or after
- 4 January 1, 2024.
- 5 SECTION 6. Section 1956.069(a), Occupations Code, as
- 6 amended by this Act, applies only to an offense committed on or
- 7 after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before
- 8 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on
- 9 the date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued
- 10 in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an
- 11 offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any
- 12 element of the offense occurred before that date.
- SECTION 7. Not later than December 1, 2023, the Department
- 14 of Public Safety by rule shall designate the online database to
- 15 which a dealer is required to report under Section 1956.0635,
- 16 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
