- SECTION 2. Section 262.1095(c), Family Code, is amended to 20

- 2 (2) the department determines providing information
- 3 is inappropriate because the individual has a criminal history or a

- 5 (3) the department is aware or believes that the

- 9 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 10 a suit affecting the parent-child relationship filed on or after
- 11 the effective date of this Act. A suit affecting the parent-child
- 12 relationship filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 13 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 14 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 15 purpose.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
