A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to an increase in the amount of the exemption of residence

homesteads from ad valorem taxation by a school district, an 3

adjustment in the amount of the limitation on school district ad 4

5 valorem taxes imposed on the residence homesteads of the elderly or

disabled to reflect increases in the exemption amount, and the 6

7 protection of school districts against the resulting loss in local

8 revenue.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 9
- SECTION 1. Section 11.13(b), Tax Code, is amended to read as 10
- 11 follows:
- 12 An adult is entitled to exemption from taxation by a
- school district of \$100,000 [\$40,000] of the appraised value of the 13
- 14 adult's residence homestead, except that only \$5,000 of the
- exemption applies to an entity operating under former Chapter 17, 15
- 16 18, 25, 26, 27, or 28, Education Code, as those chapters existed on
- May 1, 1995, as permitted by Section 11.301, Education Code. 17
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 11.26, Tax Code, is amended by amending
- Subsections (a), (a-10), and (o) and adding Subsection (a-11) to 19
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (a) The tax officials shall appraise the property to which
- this section applies and calculate taxes as on other property, but 22
- 23 if the tax so calculated exceeds the limitation imposed by this
- section, the tax imposed is the amount of the tax as limited by this 24

1 section, except as otherwise provided by this section. A school district may not increase the total annual amount of ad valorem tax 2 3 it imposes on the residence homestead of an individual 65 years of age or older or on the residence homestead of an individual who is 4 5 disabled, as defined by Section 11.13, above the amount of the tax it imposed in the first tax year in which the individual qualified 6 that residence homestead for the applicable exemption provided by 7 8 Section 11.13(c) for an individual who is 65 years of age or older If the individual qualified that residence or is disabled. 9 10 homestead for the exemption after the beginning of that first year 11 and the residence homestead remains eligible for the same exemption 12 for the next year, and if the school district taxes imposed on the residence homestead in the next year are less than the amount of 13 14 taxes imposed in that first year, a school district may not 15 subsequently increase the total annual amount of ad valorem taxes it imposes on the residence homestead above the amount it imposed in 16 17 the year immediately following the first year for which the individual qualified that residence homestead for 18 19 exemption, except as provided by Subsection (b). If the first tax year the individual qualified the residence homestead for the 20 exemption provided by Section 11.13(c) for individuals 65 years of 21 age or older or disabled was a tax year before the 2024 [2015] tax 22 23 year, the amount of the limitation provided by this section for the 24 2024 tax year is the amount of the limitation as computed under Subsection (a-10) of this section [tax the school district imposed 25 26 for the 2014 tax year] less an amount equal to the product of \$60,000 and [amount determined by multiplying \$10,000 times] the 27

- 1 tax rate of the school district for the 2024 [2015] tax year[7 plus
- 2 any 2015 tax attributable to improvements made in 2014, other than
- 3 improvements made to comply with governmental regulations or
- 4 repairs].
- 5 (a-10) For purposes of this section, "maximum compressed
- 6 rate" means the maximum compressed rate of a school district as
- 7 <u>calculated under Section 48.2551</u>, <u>Education Code</u>. Notwithstanding
- 8 the other provisions of this section, if in the 2024 or a subsequent
- 9 tax year an individual qualifies for a limitation on tax increases
- 10 provided by this section on the individual's residence homestead,
- 11 the amount of the limitation provided by this section on the
- 12 homestead is equal to the amount computed by:
- 13 (1) multiplying the taxable value of the homestead in
- 14 the preceding tax year by a tax rate equal to the difference between
- 15 the school district's maximum compressed rate for the preceding tax
- 16 year and the district's maximum compressed rate for the current tax
- 17 year;
- 18 (2) subtracting the amount computed under Subdivision
- 19 (1) from the amount of tax the district imposed on the homestead in
- 20 the preceding tax year; and
- 21 (3) adding any tax imposed in the current tax year
- 22 attributable to improvements made in the preceding tax year as
- 23 provided by Subsection (b) to the amount computed under Subdivision
- 24 (2).
- 25 (a-11) This subsection applies only to an individual who in
- 26 the 2024 tax year qualifies for a limitation under this section and
- 27 for whom the 2021 tax year or an earlier tax year was the first tax

- 1 year the individual or the individual's spouse qualified for an
- 2 exemption under Section 11.13(c). The amount of the limitation
- 3 provided by this section on the residence homestead of an
- 4 individual to which this subsection applies for the 2024 tax year is
- 5 the amount of the limitation for the 2024 tax year as otherwise
- 6 computed under this section less an amount equal to the product of
- 7 \$15,000 and the tax rate of the school district for the 2022 tax
- 8 year. This subsection expires January 1, 2025.
- 9 (o) Notwithstanding Subsections (a) $[\frac{}{}, (a-3),]$ and (b), an
- 10 improvement to property that would otherwise constitute an
- 11 improvement under Subsection (b) is not treated as an improvement
- 12 under that subsection if the improvement is a replacement structure
- 13 for a structure that was rendered uninhabitable or unusable by a
- 14 casualty or by wind or water damage. For purposes of appraising the
- 15 property in the tax year in which the structure would have
- 16 constituted an improvement under Subsection (b), the replacement
- 17 structure is considered to be an improvement under that subsection
- 18 only if:
- 19 (1) the square footage of the replacement structure
- 20 exceeds that of the replaced structure as that structure existed
- 21 before the casualty or damage occurred; or
- 22 (2) the exterior of the replacement structure is of
- 23 higher quality construction and composition than that of the
- 24 replaced structure.
- 25 SECTION 3. Section 46.071, Education Code, is amended by
- 26 amending Subsections (a-1) and (b-1) and adding Subsections (a-2),
- 27 (b-2), and (c-2) to read as follows:

(a-1) For [Beginning with] the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 1 school years [year], a school district is entitled to additional 2 3 state aid under this subchapter to the extent that state and local revenue used to service debt eligible under this chapter is less 4 5 than the state and local revenue that would have been available to the district under this chapter as it existed on September 1, 2021, 6 if any increase in the residence homestead exemption under Section 7 8 1-b(c), Article VIII, Texas Constitution, as proposed by the 87th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2021, had not occurred. 9 (a-2) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, a school 10 district is entitled to additional state aid under this subchapter 11 12 to the extent that state and local revenue used to service debt eligible under this chapter is less than the state and local revenue 13 14 that would have been available to the district under this chapter as 15 it existed on September 1, 2023, if any increase in the residence homestead exemption under Section 1-b(c), Article VIII, Texas 16 17 Constitution, and any additional limitation on tax increases under Section 1-b(d) of that article as proposed by the 88th Legislature, 18 19 Regular Session, 2023, had not occurred. Subsections (c-1), (d), 20 (b-1) Subject to and (e), 21 additional state aid under this section for [beginning with] the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 school years $[\frac{year}]$ is equal to the amount 22 by which the loss of local interest and sinking revenue for debt 23 24 service attributable to any increase in the residence homestead exemption under Section 1-b(c), Article VIII, Texas Constitution, 25 26 as proposed by the 87th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2021, is

not offset by a gain in state aid under this chapter.

- 1 (b-2) Subject to Subsections (c-2), (d), and (e), additional state aid under this section beginning with the 2 2024-2025 school year is equal to the amount by which the loss of 3 local interest and sinking revenue for debt service attributable to 4 any increase in the residence homestead exemption under Section 5 1-b(c), Article VIII, Texas Constitution, and any additional 6 7 limitation on tax increases under Section 1-b(d) of that article as proposed by the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, is not 8
- 10 (c-2) For the purpose of determining state aid under
 11 Subsections (a-2) and (b-2), local interest and sinking revenue for
 12 debt service is limited to revenue required to service debt
 13 eligible under this chapter as of September 1, 2024, including
 14 refunding of that debt, subject to Section 46.061. The limitation
 15 imposed by Section 46.034(a) does not apply for the purpose of
 16 determining state aid under this section.

- 21 Act takes effect January 1, 2024, but only if the constitutional
- 22 amendment proposed by the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023,
- 23 to increase the amount of the exemption of residence homesteads
- 24 from ad valorem taxation by a school district and to adjust the
- 25 amount of the limitation on school district ad valorem taxes
- 26 imposed on the residence homesteads of the elderly or disabled to
- 27 reflect increases in the exemption amount is approved by the
