A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

L	AN ACT

- 2 relating to eligibility for law enforcement officer service in the
- 3 Employees Retirement System of Texas by certain peace officers
- 4 commissioned by the comptroller.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 811.001(9), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (9) "Law enforcement officer" means a member of the
- 9 retirement system who:
- 10 (A) has been commissioned as a law enforcement
- 11 officer by the Department of Public Safety, the Texas Alcoholic
- 12 Beverage Commission, the Parks and Wildlife Department, [or] the
- 13 office of inspector general at the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 14 Department, or the comptroller; and
- 15 (B) is recognized as a commissioned law
- 16 enforcement officer by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.
- SECTION 2. Section 814.104(b), Government Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (b) A member who is at least 55 years old and who has at
- 20 least 10 years of service credit as a commissioned peace officer
- 21 engaged in criminal law enforcement activities of the Department of
- 22 Public Safety, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, the Parks
- 23 and Wildlife Department, [or) the office of inspector general at
- 24 the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, or the comptroller, or as a

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- 1 custodial officer, is eligible to retire and receive a service
- 2 retirement annuity.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 815.505, Government Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 815.505. CERTIFICATION OF NAMES OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND
- 6 CUSTODIAL OFFICERS. Not later than the 12th day of the month
- 7 following the month in which a person begins or ceases employment as
- 8 a law enforcement officer or custodial officer, the Public Safety
- 9 Commission, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, the Parks and
- 10 Wildlife Commission, the office of inspector general at the Texas
- 11 Juvenile Justice Department, the Board of Pardons and Paroles, [or]
- 12 the Texas Board of Criminal Justice, or the comptroller, as
- 13 applicable, shall certify to the retirement system, in the manner
- 14 prescribed by the system, the name of the employee and such other
- 15 information as the system determines is necessary for the crediting
- 16 of service and financing of benefits under this subtitle.
- 17 SECTION 4. (a) The changes in law made to Subtitle B, Title
- 18 8, Government Code, by this Act apply to a member of the Employees
- 19 Retirement System of Texas who is employed as a commissioned peace
- 20 officer by the comptroller on or after the effective date of this
- 21 Act regardless of whether the member was hired by the comptroller
- 22 before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.
- 23 (b) Service credit established by a member described by
- 24 Subsection (a) of this section that was earned by the member in the
- 25 position of a commissioned peace officer before the effective date
- 26 of this Act is considered service credit established as a law
- 27 enforcement officer for purposes of determining the benefits

- 1 payable from the law enforcement and custodial officer supplemental
- 2 retirement fund.
- 3 (c) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 4 Act, the board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System of
- 5 Texas, in consultation with the comptroller, may adopt rules
- 6 necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 7 (d) The comptroller shall:
- 8 (1) as soon as practicable after the effective date of
- 9 this Act, certify to the Employees Retirement System of Texas, in
- 10 the form and manner prescribed by the board of trustees of the
- 11 retirement system:
- 12 (A) the name of each member who is employed as a
- 13 commissioned peace officer by the comptroller on the effective date
- 14 of this Act;
- 15 (B) the amount of service credit established by
- 16 the member as a commissioned peace officer before the effective
- 17 date of this Act; and
- 18 (C) any other information the retirement system
- 19 determines is necessary to credit law enforcement officer service
- 20 in accordance with the changes in law made by this Act; and
- 21 (2) beginning with the first pay period that occurs
- 22 after the effective date of this Act and with respect to each member
- 23 employed by the comptroller as a commissioned peace officer, begin
- 24 making deductions and collecting contributions for the law
- 25 enforcement and custodial officer supplemental retirement fund as
- 26 prescribed by Section 815.402(h), Government Code.
- 27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023, but only

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- 1 if funds are appropriated for the purpose of providing benefits
- 2 under this Act. If funds are not appropriated for that purpose,
- 3 this Act does not take effect.
