9	activity, including interscholastic, intercollegiate, intramural,
10	recreational, semiprofessional, and professional sports

12	(3) "Athletic training" means the form of health care
13	that includes principles and methods for managing and treating
14	athletic injuries for athletic individuals in good general health
15	[the practice of preventing, recognizing, assessing, managing,
16	treating, disposing of, and reconditioning athletic injuries]
17	under the direction of a physician licensed in this state or another
18	qualified, licensed health professional who is authorized to refer
19	for health care services within the scope of the person's license_
20	and consists of:
21	(A) managing the risk of an athletic injury or
22	<u>illness;</u>
23	(B) preventing an athletic injury or illness;
24	(C) assessing an athletic injury or illness;

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- 1 (D) providing immediate emergency care;
  2 (E) providing therapeutic intervention for an
  3 athletic injury; and
  4 (F) reconditioning an athletic injury or
  5 illness.
