1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of a physical therapist to treat a patient
3	without a referral.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 453.301(a), Occupations Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(a) A physical therapist may treat a patient for an injury
8	or condition in a manner described by Section 453.005 without a
9	referral [if the physical therapist:
10	[(1) has been licensed to practice physical therapy
11	for at least one year;
12	[(2) is covered by professional liability insurance in
13	the minimum amount required by board rule; and
14	[(3) either:
15	[(A) possesses a doctoral degree in physical
16	therapy from:
17	[(i) a program that is accredited by the
18	Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education; or
19	[(ii) an institution that is accredited by
20	an agency or association recognized by the United States secretary
21	of education; or
22	[(B) has completed at least 30 hours of
23	continuing competence activities in the area of differential
24	diagnosis].

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- 1 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 453.302, Occupations
- 2 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 453.302. PROVISION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE [TREATING
- 4 PATIENT WITHOUT REFERRAL].
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 453.302(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) In an emergency circumstance, including a minor
- 8 emergency, a physical therapist may provide emergency medical care
- 9 to a person to the best of the therapist's ability [without a
- 10 referral from a referring practitioner].
- 11 SECTION 4. The following provisions of the Occupations Code
- 12 are repealed:
- 13 (1) Section 453.001(9);
- 14 (2) Sections 453.301(a-1), (a-2), and (b); and
- 15 (3) Section 453.302(c).
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
