## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of physician graduates and
- 3 the authority of an insured to select a physician graduate under the
- 4 insured's health insurance policy; requiring an occupational
- 5 license; authorizing fees.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Chapter 155, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 8 adding Subchapter E to read as follows:

## SUBCHAPTER E. PHYSICIAN GRADUATE

- 10 Sec. 155.201. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 11 (1) "Physician graduate" means an individual issued a
- 12 <u>limited license under this subchapter to practice medicine under a</u>
- 13 supervising practice agreement with a sponsoring physician.
- 14 (2) "Sponsoring physician" means a physician who
- 15 enters into a supervising practice agreement with a physician
- 16 graduate.

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- 17 (3) "Supervising practice agreement" means an
- 18 agreement between a sponsoring physician and a physician graduate
- 19 regarding the supervision by the sponsoring physician of the
- 20 physician graduate's practice of medicine.
- Sec. 155.202. RULES. The board shall adopt rules in
- 22 <u>accordance with this subchapter relating to the licensing and</u>
- 23 regulation of physician graduates, including rules relating to:
- 24 (1) procedures and fees for the issuance, term, and

- 1 renewal of a license under this subchapter, including continuing
- 2 medical education requirements for renewal of the license;
- 3 (2) practices and requirements for the supervision of
- 4 physician graduates; and
- 5 (3) any other matter necessary to ensure protection of
- 6 the public, including disciplinary procedures.
- 7 Sec. 155.203. LICENSE ISSUANCE. On application, the board
- 8 shall issue a limited license to practice medicine under this
- 9 subchapter to an applicant who:
- 10 <u>(1) is a resident of this state and is:</u>
- 11 (A) a United States citizen or a legal permanent
- 12 resident; or
- 13 (B) otherwise authorized under federal law to
- 14 work in the United States;
- 15 (2) has proficiency in the English language;
- 16 (3) has graduated:
- 17 (A) in the two years preceding the date that the
- 18 applicant initially applies for a physician graduate license, from:
- (i) a board-recognized accredited medical
- 20 school or osteopathic medical school in the United States or
- 21 <u>Canada; or</u>
- (ii) a medical school located outside of
- 23 the United States and Canada that is recognized by the board as
- 24 acceptable; or
- 25 (B) if the applicant is licensed in good standing
- 26 to practice medicine in another country, from a medical school
- 27 located outside of the United States and Canada that is recognized

1 by the board as acceptable; 2 (4) has passed the first and second components of the United States Medical Licensing Examination or equivalent 3 components of another <u>board-approved</u> <u>licensing</u> examination 4 5 described by Section 155.0511; (5) is not enrolled in a board-approved postgraduate 6 7 residency program; and 8 (6) meets any other requirement prescribed by board rule. 9 Sec. 155.204. FEES. The amount of a fee for the issuance or 10 renewal of a license under this subchapter may not exceed the amount 11 12 of a fee for the issuance or renewal of a physician assistant 13 license under Chapter 204. 14 Sec. 155.205. SPONSORING PHYSICIAN. (a) A physician is 15 eligible to enter into a supervising practice agreement as a sponsoring physician if the physician: 16 17 (1) holds a full and unrestricted license to practice medicine issued under this subtitle; 18 19 (2) has not been and is not currently the subject of disciplinary action by the board or the medical licensing authority 20 of any other jurisdiction; 21 22 (3) is certified by a medical specialty member board 23 of: 24 (A) the American Board of Medical Specialties; or 25 (B) the American Osteopathic Association Bureau 26 of Osteopathic Specialists; and 27 (4) practices medicine in the specialty for which the

- 1 physician is certified under Subdivision (3).
- 2 (b) A sponsoring physician who enters into a supervising
- 3 practice agreement with a physician graduate shall comply with all
- 4 board rules related to the supervision of physician graduates.
- 5 (c) The board by rule shall establish the maximum number of
- 6 physician graduates that a sponsoring physician may supervise under
- 7 <u>supervising practice agreements.</u>
- 8 Sec. 155.206. SUPERVISING PRACTICE AGREEMENT REQUIRED. (a)
- 9 A physician graduate shall enter into a supervising practice
- 10 agreement with a sponsoring physician.
- 11 (b) A physician graduate who has not entered into a
- 12 supervising practice agreement may not practice or attempt to
- 13 practice medicine.
- 14 (c) A physician graduate who enters into a supervising
- 15 practice agreement may practice under the delegation and
- 16 supervision of another physician if:
- 17 (1) the sponsoring physician authorizes the practice
- 18 of the physician graduate under the delegation and supervision of
- 19 the other physician in a written document that identifies the other
- 20 physician by name; and
- 21 (2) the other physician is:
- (A) part of the sponsoring physician's physician
- 23 group or facility; and
- 24 (B) certified in the same specialty as the
- 25 sponsoring physician by a medical specialty member board of:
- (i) the American Board of Medical
- 27 Specialties; or

- 1 <u>(ii) the American Osteopathic Association</u>
- 2 Bureau of Osteopathic Specialists.
- 3 (d) The physician profile under Section 154.006 of a
- 4 sponsoring physician or physician graduate must indicate in the
- 5 manner prescribed by board rule that the sponsoring physician or
- 6 physician graduate has entered into a supervising practice
- 7 agreement.
- 8 Sec. 155.207. LIMITED PRACTICE BY LICENSE HOLDER. (a) A
- 9 physician graduate may provide only medical services in the
- 10 specialty in which the physician graduate's sponsoring physician is
- 11 certified as described by Section 155.205(a)(3) under supervision
- 12 in accordance with a supervising practice agreement.
- 13 (b) Before a license holder under this subchapter provides a
- 14 treatment, consultation, or other medical service, the license
- 15 <u>holder must disclose to the patient:</u>
- 16 (1) that the license holder is a physician graduate;
- 17 and
- 18 (2) if asked, that the license holder has not
- 19 completed any formal specialized postgraduate or resident
- 20 training.
- 21 <u>(c) A physician graduate may not prescribe a Schedule II</u>
- 22 controlled substance.
- Sec. 155.208. LIABILITY OF SUPERVISING PHYSICIAN. A
- 24 sponsoring physician who enters into a supervising practice
- 25 agreement with a physician graduate is responsible at all times for
- 26 the oversight of and is liable for any medical act performed or the
- 27 omission of any medical act by the physician graduate in the

- 1 provision of medical services.
- 2 Sec. 155.209. IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS; USE OF TITLE.
- 3 (a) The holder of a license issued under this subchapter shall at
- 4 all times while practicing as a physician graduate display a
- 5 personal identification document identifying the license holder as
- 6 a physician graduate.
- 7 (b) A physician graduate may use the following titles or
- 8 abbreviations:
- 9 (1) "doctor"; or
- 10 <u>(2) "Dr." or "d</u>oc."
- 11 Sec. 155.210. STATUS OF PHYSICIAN GRADUATE. A physician
- 12 graduate license holder is considered a general practitioner for
- 13 purposes of regulations of the federal Centers for Medicare and
- 14 Medicaid Services.
- Sec. 155.211. LICENSE RENEWAL. The board may not renew a
- 16 license issued under this subchapter unless:
- 17 (1) the board verifies that the license holder has
- 18 practiced in accordance with this subchapter under a supervising
- 19 practice agreement with a sponsoring physician in the license term
- 20 preceding the application for renewal; and
- 21 (2) the license holder satisfies the continuing
- 22 medical education requirements established by board rule.
- 23 Sec. 155.212. DENIAL, SUSPENSION, OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE.
- 24 The board may deny an application for licensure or suspend or revoke
- 25 a license issued under this subchapter:
- 26 (1) for any ground provided by Chapter 164 or board
- 27 rule; and

- 1 (2) in the manner provided by Chapter 164 and board
- 2 rule.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 1451.001, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subdivision (16-a) to read as follows:
- 5 (16-a) "Physician graduate" has the meaning assigned
- 6 by Section 155.201, Occupations Code.
- 7 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 1451, Insurance Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 1451.129 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1451.129. SELECTION OF PHYSICIAN GRADUATE. An insured
- 10 may select a physician graduate to provide the services scheduled
- 11 in the health insurance policy that are within the scope of the
- 12 physician graduate's license under Subchapter E, Chapter 155,
- 13 Occupations Code.
- 14 SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2024, the Texas Medical
- 15 Board shall adopt rules as necessary to implement Subchapter E,
- 16 Chapter 155, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. Section 1451.129, Insurance Code, as added by
- 18 this Act, applies only to a health insurance policy that is
- 19 delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1,
- 20 2024.
- 21 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
