BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Sections 317.004 and 317.010, Labor Code, are amended to read as follows:

To be eligible to Sec. 317.004. PROVIDER ELIGIBILITY. participate as a provider under the program, a provider must:

apply to the commission in the manner prescribed (1)by commission rule;

be a public, nonprofit, or private entity that is:
 (A) authorized under the Education Code or other (2)

state law to grant a high school diploma; or

(B) accredited by a regional accrediting body and

working in partnership with an entity described by Paragraph (A);

(3) have at least two years of experience providing dropout reengagement services to adult students, including recruitment, learning plan development, and proactive coaching and mentoring, leading to the obtainment of a high school diploma;

be equipped to:

provide: (A)

academic skill intake assessment (i) transcript evaluations;

(ii) remediation coursework in literacy and

numeracy;

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(iii) research-validated academic а

resiliency assessment and intervention;

(iv) employability skills development aligned to employer needs;

(v) career pathways coursework;
(vi) preparation for the attainment of industry-recognized credentials; and

> (vii) career placement services; and

(B) develop a learning plan that integrates academic requirements and career goals; and
