H.B. No. 2645

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to a pilot program to increase the financial independence

- 3 of foster youth who are transitioning to independent living.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 264, Family Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 264.1215 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 264.1215. PILOT PROGRAM FOR FINANCIAL TRANSITIONAL
- 8 LIVING SERVICES. (a) The department shall establish a pilot
- 9 program to assist foster youth to achieve financial security and
- 10 independence as the youth transition to independent living.
- 11 (b) The department shall enter into an agreement with one or
- 12 more banks, credit unions, or other financial institutions to
- 13 <u>establish savings and checking accounts for foster youth who are at</u>
- 14 least 14 but not more than 21 years of age and participate in the
- 15 pilot program. The agreement must include the following terms:
- 16 (1) notwithstanding Section 34.305(c), Finance Code,
- 17 <u>a requirement that foster youth participating in the program are</u>
- 18 the sole owner of the savings and checking accounts and may
- 19 establish savings and checking accounts without a co-signor;
- 20 (2) a requirement that the department and the bank,
- 21 credit union, or other financial institution together encourage the
- 22 foster youth participating in the program to open or continue
- 23 private savings and checking accounts once the participants are no
- 24 longer eligible for the program;

- 1 (3) procedures to ensure the participants maintain
- 2 ownership and control of the account at the time the participants
- 3 exit the program;
- 4 (4) a requirement that the bank, credit union, or
- 5 other financial institution provide to participants in the program
- 6 <u>a checking and savings account that does not require maintenance</u>
- 7 fees and cannot incur overdraft fees, nonsufficient funds fees,
- 8 inactivity fees, or any other penalty fees; and
- 9 (5) options to make financial coaching or mentoring
- 10 available to foster youth participating in the pilot program.
- 11 (c) The department may seek to partner with persons,
- 12 including nonprofit organizations or foundations, to match the
- 13 amounts of money deposited into the foster youth savings accounts
- 14 under the pilot program. The matching funds must be deposited
- 15 <u>directly into a youth's savings account.</u>
- 16 (d) The department and a person selected as a partner under
- 17 Subsection (c) may jointly establish incentives to provide
- 18 financial rewards to foster youth for actions performed by the
- 19 youth.
- 20 (e) The department shall survey each foster youth who enters
- 21 and exits the pilot program. The survey must be designed to assess
- 22 any changes in the youth's attitudes, perceptions, and knowledge
- 23 about financial matters from the time the youth entered the program
- 24 until the youth exited the program.
- 25 (f) The department shall complete an evaluation of the pilot
- 26 program and submit a report on the evaluation of the pilot program
- 27 conducted under this section to the governor, lieutenant governor,

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- 1 and speaker of the house of representatives as soon as the
- 2 evaluation is complete but not later than December 31, 2027.
- 3 (g) A foster youth may not be denied the rights granted
- 4 under Section 264.0111 to control money earned by the youth that is
- 5 deposited into a savings or checking account under the pilot
- 6 program.
- 7 (h) If the department is unable to enter into an agreement
- 8 with a bank, credit union, or other financial institution, the
- 9 department shall include in the report required under Subsection
- 10 (f) a description of any legal or practical barriers that must be
- 11 addressed to ensure foster youth are able to participate in the
- 12 pilot program and establish savings and checking accounts before
- 13 the foster youth are no longer eligible for foster care services.
- 14 (i) This section expires January 1, 2028.
- 15 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 16 of this Act, the Department of Family and Protective Services shall
- 17 establish the pilot program as required by Section 264.1215, Family
- 18 Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
