- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 16.01, Penal Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 16.01. UNLAWFUL USE OF CRIMINAL INSTRUMENT OR CERTAIN
- 8 DEVICES [MECHANICAL SECURITY DEVICE].
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 16.01(a), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 10 as follows:
- 11 (a) A person commits an offense if:
- 12 (1) the person possesses a criminal instrument, [ex]
- 13 mechanical security device, motor vehicle key programming device,
- 14 or relay hack device with the intent to use the instrument or device
- 15 in the commission of an offense; or
- 16 (2) with knowledge of its character and with the
- 17 intent to use a criminal instrument, [or] mechanical security
- 18 device, motor vehicle key programming device, or relay hack device
- 19 or aid or permit another to use the instrument or device in the
- 20 commission of an offense, the person manufactures, adapts, sells,
- 21 installs, or sets up the instrument or device.
- SECTION 3. Section 16.01(b), Penal Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Subdivisions (3), (4), and (5) to read as follows:
- 24 (3) "Motor vehicle" has the meaning assigned by

- 1 <u>Section 32.34.</u>
- 2 (4) "Motor vehicle key programming device" means a
- 3 device designed or used to electronically communicate with a motor
- 4 vehicle for the purpose of programing a blank motor vehicle key fob
- 5 that is capable of being used to start and operate the motor
- 6 vehicle.
- 7 (5) "Relay hack device" means a device capable of
- 8 <u>intercepting the signal from a motor vehicle key fob for the purpose</u>
- 9 of:
- 10 (A) unlocking the motor vehicle; or
- 11 (B) remotely activating the ignition of the motor
- 12 vehicle.
- 13 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 14 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 15 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 16 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 17 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 18 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 19 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 20 before that date.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
