A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 38.051(a), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) A school district in this state may, if the district
- 8 identifies the need, design a model in accordance with this
- 9 subchapter for the delivery of cooperative health care programs for
- 10 students and their families and may compete for grants awarded
- 11 under this subchapter. The model may provide for the delivery of:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> conventional health services;
- 13 (2) mental health services; and
- 14 (3) disease prevention of emerging health threats that
- 15 are specific to the district.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 38.058, Education Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:

- 19 COUNCIL. (a) The board of trustees of a school district or the
- 20 governing body of an open-enrollment charter school may establish
- 21 and appoint members to a local health education and health care
- 22 advisory council to make recommendations to the district or school
- 23 on the establishment of school-based health centers to provide
- 24 health care services, including mental health services, and to

- 1 assist the district or school in ensuring that local community
- 2 values are reflected in the operation of each center and in the
- 3 provision of health education and mental health education.
- 4 (b) A majority of the members of the council must be parents
- 5 of students enrolled in the school district or open-enrollment
- 6 charter school. In addition to the appointees who are parents of
- 7 students, the board of trustees or governing body shall also
- 8 appoint at least one person from each of the following groups:
- 9 (1) classroom teachers;
- 10 (2) school administrators;
- 11 (3) school counselors;
- 12 (4) health care professionals licensed or certified to
- 13 practice in this state;
- 14 (5) mental health care professionals licensed to
- 15 practice in this state;
- 16 (6) the clergy;
- (7) $\left[\frac{(6)}{(6)}\right]$ law enforcement;
- (8) $\left[\frac{(7)}{1}\right]$ the business community;
- (9) $[\frac{(8)}{}]$ senior citizens; and
- $(10) \quad [(9)] \quad \text{students.}$
- SECTION 3. Section 38.063(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- (c) All health care programs should be designed to meet the

- 1 (3) stabilizing the physical <u>and mental</u> well-being of
- 2 a student.
- 3 SECTION 4. The board of trustees of a school district or the
- 4 governing body of an open-enrollment charter school that has
- 5 established a local health education and health care advisory
- 6 council under Section 38.058, Education Code, shall appoint to the
- 7 council a mental health professional licensed in this state, as
- 8 required by the change in law made by this Act, as soon as
- 9 practicable and not later than January 1, 2024.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
