## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 7.040(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (a) The agency shall prepare information comparing
- 10 institutions of higher education in this state and post the
- 11 information on the agency's Internet website. Information prepared
- 12 under this section shall be given to  $\underline{any}$  [ $\underline{a}$ ] public  $\underline{or}$  private
- 13 school student who requests the information. The information
- 14 shall:
- 15 (1) identify postsecondary education and career
- 16 opportunities, including information that states the benefits of
- 17 four-year and two-year higher education programs, postsecondary
- 18 technical education, skilled workforce careers, and career
- 19 education programs;
- 20 (2) assist prospective postsecondary students in
- 21 assessing the value of a certificate program, associate or
- 22 <u>baccalaureate degree program, or other credential program offered</u>
- 23 by an institution of higher education by comparing [compare] each
- 24 institution [of higher education] with other institutions using

26	debt within the standard 10-year repayment period or, if this
27	information is not available for the program, the percentage of

- 1 students in all certificate programs, degree programs, or other
- 2 credential programs who fully repay student debt within the
- 3 standard 10-year repayment period; and
- 4 (5) educational outcomes for students seeking the
- 5 certificate, degree, or other credential, including:
- 6 (A) for a program designed to be completed in
- 7 more than one year, the percentage of students who continue in the
- 8 program after the first year of study;
- 9 (B) the graduation rate;
- 10 (C) the percentage of students who withdraw or
- 11 transfer from the institution and subsequently graduate with the
- 12 certificate, degree, or other credential from another institution
- 13 of higher education or private or independent institution of higher
- 14 education;
- 15 (D) the percentage of students who withdraw from
- 16 the institution and do not enroll in the program at another
- 17 institution of higher education or private or independent
- 18 institution of higher education within three years of the
- 19 withdrawal; and
- (E) the percentage of graduates employed in a
- 21 <u>field related to the certificate program, degree program, or other</u>
- 22 <u>credential program within one year of graduation.</u>
- 23 <u>(c) The board may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and</u>
- 24 donations from any public or private source to implement this
- 25 section.
- 26 (d) The board shall adopt rules as necessary to implement
- 27 this section, including rules to ensure compliance with federal and

- 1 state law regarding the confidentiality of student information.
- 2 SECTION 5. Section 7.040(c), Education Code, is transferred
- 3 to Section 61.09022, Education Code, as added by this Act,
- 4 redesignated as Section 61.09022(b), Education Code, and amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) [<del>(c)</del>] Each institution of higher education shall
- 7 include on its Internet website, in a prominent location that is not
- 8 more than three hyperlinks from the website's home page, a link to
- 9 the electronic tools or platforms developed by the board
- 10 [information posted on the agency's Internet website] under
- 11 Subsection (a).
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 2308A.007, Government Code, is amended
- 13 by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 14 (a-1) A credential library established under this section
- 15 must include the information included in the electronic tools or
- 16 platforms developed by the coordinating board under Section
- 17 <u>61.09022(a)</u>, Education Code.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
