2	relating to periodic occupational cancer screenings for
3	firefighters.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Wade Cannon Act.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 180, Local Government Code, is amended
7	by adding Section 180.010 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 180.010. OCCUPATIONAL CANCER SCREENING FOR
9	FIREFIGHTERS. (a) In this section, "firefighter" means an
10	individual defined as fire protection personnel under Section
11	419.021, Government Code.
12	(b) A political subdivision that employs firefighters shall
13	offer an occupational cancer screening to each firefighter at no
14	cost to the firefighter in the fifth year of the firefighter's
15	employment, and once every three years following the initial
16	screening.
17	(c) The occupational cancer screening must be confidential
18	and test for each type of cancer, including:
19	(1) colorectal cancer;
20	(2) prostate cancer, if applicable;
21	(3) lung cancer; and
22	(4) brain cancer.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
