4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Chapter 180, Local Government Code, is amended

6 by adding Section 180.010 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 180.010. OCCUPATIONAL CANCER SCREENING FOR

8 FIREFIGHTERS. (a) In this section, "firefighter" means an

9 individual defined as fire protection personnel under Section

10 419.021, Government Code.

11 (b) A political subdivision that employs firefighters shall

12 offer an occupational cancer screening to each firefighter at no

13 cost to the firefighter in the fifth year of the firefighter's

14 employment, and once every three years following the initial

15 screening.

16 (c) The occupational cancer screening must be confidential

17 and test for each type of cancer, including:

18 <u>(1)</u> colorectal cancer;

(2) prostate cancer, if applicable;

20 (3) lung cancer; and

21 (4) brain cancer.
